Parson to Person

Dear People of Grace,

As I wrote this salutation to you, I thought to myself that being called "People of Grace" is reason enough to belong to this parish! For that is who we want to be, isn't it? We want to be people through whom the grace of God flows. We talk about the grace of God as if we know what that means. We know that it means something really good that comes from God. You may have heard me say before that "grace" is a churchy word for "gift" or "gifts."

The grace of God reminds us that our relationship with God is all about receiving gifts from God. Everything is a gift. We receive gifts such as God's mercy and loving kindness. In the Old Testament, we are reminded of God's "steadfast love," which is another gift. Even our faith is a gift given to us by God.

What is wonderful

about the grace of God is that it reminds us that everything in our life of faith is a response to God's initiative. Because we are God's children, made in God's image and likeness, God cares for us and provides for us like a loving parent. Jesus taught us to pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven" reminding us that God is our heavenly parent, who loves and nurtures us throughout our lives. Even if we did not have a good earthly father or mother, God is our Heavenly Parent, and as we learn to trust God, God lets us know what a loving parent is supposed to be.

God has been called the "Hound of Heaven," who forever "tracks us" and does not give up until we are found. God uses all sorts and conditions of people in our lives to draw us closer. Remembering how God used Cyrus, the King of Persia, who did not know the living God at the time, we are reminded that the Hound of Heaven might use anyone or anything to get our attention.

If you don't like the thought of being hounded by God, another image is of the Good Shepherd, who leaves the ninety-nine sheep in the fold to search for one sheep, and who does not quit searching until that one sheep is brought back safe to the fold. Beloved, that one sheep is you. That one sheep is me. That one sheep may well be every person who ever lived. Wouldn't that be just like the Hound of Heaven or the

Good Shepherd not to quit, not to rest, until all are safe in the fold?

You may have heard this before, but it's worth remembering: the acronym for the word grace is " \underline{G} od's <u>r</u>iches <u>at</u> \underline{C} hrist's <u>e</u>xpense." It reminds us that the Incarnation is not only about God coming in the flesh so that we could see first-hand who God is, but it is also about Jesus offering Himself

for the sins of the world. Through the mystery of the crucifixion and resurrection, Jesus defeated death and sin and hell and opened the way to the Father for all people. In Holy Scripture we read, "If any sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the perfect offering for our sins, and not for ours only, but for the sins of the whole world" (I John 2:1-2). Therefore the good news of the Gospel is that Jesus is the universal Savior, the Savior of the whole world. Thanks be to God!

People of Grace, let's live into our name during this new year. Let's be who we are and proclaim the grace or gift of God's salvation to all and for all.

Recently all members of the congregation received an email from the national Episcopal Church Foundation about a possibly helpful financial arrangement called a Charitable Gift Annuity (CGA). We can give you more details; the CGA is perfect for people who need more income now! It gives you five to seven percent annual income, depending on your age, for the rest of your life. If you use a gift of appreciated stock, you will not have to pay the capital gains tax you would if you liquidated the stock. You also get a generous income-tax deduction.

So, if you have some stock that is producing less than one percent income, it might work for you to give it to Grace Church so that we can give you better income. A Slow November

Total November contributions of \$33,800 were \$1,440 under budget primarily due to a shortfall in pledged income. When combined with Building and all Other Income, November book income was \$2,602.44 over budget. Income from all sources at the end of November totaled \$406,941 falling \$2,464 short of the targeted \$409,405.

Total November expenses of \$39,054 were \$1,835 over budget due to Mission & Outreach and Operations costs. Even though year-to-date expenses of \$394,167 were \$15,237 under budget, there are \$37,219 budgeted expenses left to be paid in December.

As we quickly approach the end of 2013, we are prayerful that contributions will be in line to cover the remaining budgeted needs of the church.
