#### Parson to Person

Dear People of Grace,

Let me begin by wishing all of you a healthy and happy New Year and Epiphany Season! I have a couple of thoughts to share with you as we begin this New Year together.

The first of these thoughts came out of a Vestry Discussion at our meeting in December. One of our Vestry members said that he thinks

that we at Grace should challenge one another more regarding making sacrifices for Christ and His Church. The more I reflected upon his comment, the more correct I think he was.

Where serving Christ is concerned, I know I have emphasized that when you find your ministry, when you are doing what God wants you to do, it will be enjoyable and fulfilling. As I thought about what our Vestry member said and as I have reflected on my own experience, I have to admit that serv

have to admit that serving Christ is not always enjoyable and fulfilling. In fact, as I think back on several experiences I have had, some of the most fulfilling have been doing things that I felt called to do, but not things I particularly wanted to do at all.

It is my understanding that the Roman Catholic Church used to encourage its people to make sacrifices to God by accepting calls to serve that folks knew would be difficult. The more difficult the call, the greater was the sacrifice. I think they were on to something. When I began as a tutor for "Read to Succeed" several years ago, I really didn't know what I was getting myself into. Working with a child from one of the housing projects here in Asheville, I knew, was work that needed to be done. I wasn't a particularly good tutor, and consequently the work itself was hard, but helped this child learn to read better, which was critical for his future. I'm just saying that rather than always looking for comething in serving Christ that

The other thing is that whatever it is, you don't have to do it forever. But, your willingness to serve, your willingness to give something a try, I think, will make God smile.

I would love to have some traveling companions on this journey so we can encourage one another and, from time to time, discuss what we are hearing in our reading. It should take you less than twenty minutes to read the daily portions of Scripture allotted. So, call

me at 273-0635 if you are willing to try and accompany me on this journey. I ask for your prayers for me, and any who might choose to make this journey with me. I am told that, though it is arduous, it is a journey worth making, and by gaining more familiarity with Holy Scripture, it will deepen one's relationship with God, (which is the point of making such a journey in the first place). I started on Monday, January 4, but you may join me at any time on the journey this year that works for you.

# Six-Week Study on the Religion of Islam Begins January 7

A six week course on "The Religion of Islam" begins Thursday, January 7, at 6:30 p.m. With all of the news flashes regarding Muslim extremists like ISIS, it seems prudent to spend some time learning about the true religion of Islam, which is a peaceful religion and which has much in common with both Christianity and Judaism. We will be using a DVD program from *The Great Courses Company* featuring Professor John L. Esposito, an expert in the study of Islam and a Professor of Islamic Studies at Georgetown University.

It is our hope that those of us who take advantage of this study will come away more informed about the true religion of Islam and will be able to hold helpful and healing conversations about Islam with others. The classes will be held from 6:30 p.m. to no later than 8:00 p.m. on Thursday evenings beginning January 7. All are welcome. Come and bring a friend with you. We will probably be meeting in the Edwards Library assuming that it will hold the group.

### Confirmation/Inquirers Classes in Preparation for Bishop Taylor's Visit

Our Bishop, the Rt. Rev. G. Porter Taylor, will be joining us for his visitation and Confirmation on Sunday, April 10, 2016. In preparation for what will probably his final visit with us prior to his retirement, Confirmation/Inquirers Classes for both young people and adults will be offered.

We call these classes Confirmation/Inquirers Classes because they are for anyone who wants to know more about the history, worship, sacraments, traditions, practices and polity of The Episcopal Church as well as what it means to follow our Lord Jesus in the Episcopal or Anglican tradition. It is an excellent opportunity for people new to The Episcopal Church to receive an orientation to our practice of the Christian faith. These classes also assist our young people to prepare to affirm the faith at confirmation for themselves that was affirmed for them at their baptisms. It is also open to long-time members who would like to come for a refresher and/or to meet and assist newcomers to The Episcopal Church and to Grace Church in their faith journeys. It is only after being informed through the classes that one makes the decision to be confirmed, which is the formal way of joining The Episcopal Church through the laying on of hands by our bishop.

**Confirmation/Inquirers Classes for Young People ages 12-18** will most likely be held on Sunday from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. beginning Sunday, February 21, and continuing through Sunday, April 3 (with the exception of March 27, which is Easter Sunday). We will also meet on Saturday morning, April 9, at 10:00 a.m., the day before Confirmation, for Confirmation rehearsal.

**Confirmation/Inquirers Classes for Adults** (and any make-up classes for our young people) will be held on six consecutive Wednesday evenings, 7-8:00 p.m. beginning Wednesday, February 24, through Wednesday, April 6, (with the exception of Wednesday, March 30, during Easter week). Confirmation rehearsal for adults will also be held on Saturday, April 9, at 10:00 a.m., the day before Confirmation.

Fr. Coffey will be leading these classes with help from lay people as needed. Please contact him at garycoffey77@ gmail.com with questions and with the names of students for the class.

### "Listen for a Change: Sacred Conversations for Racial Justice," January 21-23

Asheville Area Episcopal Churches are sponsoring the Trinity Institute's 45th National Theological Conference. The conference, entitled "Listen for a Change: Sacred Conversations for Racial Justice," will be hosted by partner site Trinity Episcopal Church, Asheville, January 21-23, 2016.

With the recent events in Ferguson, Mo., Staten Island, NY, and Charleston, SC, many across the United States have come to question whether our nation can ever achieve racial equality within our institutions and social interactions.

From January 21-23, a leading group of activists, scholars, authors, artists and experts on racial inequality will come together to hold life-giving conversations on the racial issues of our time, including structural racism, mass incarceration, and policy change.

Conference participation is open to anyone interested in a practical, theological perspective on racial equality and is ideal for seminarians, students, and church leaders looking for thought-leadership from experts and activists.

The live conference will be held at Trinity Church (Broadway at Wall Street, New York City). As a partner site, Trinity Asheville will offer all aspects of the conference in real time, via webcast—where participants can submit questions for speakers via email during the live Q&A. Onsite reflection groups are coordinated using materials prepared and provided by Trinity Institute.

We are all part of the solution to racism in our lives. The Episcopal Churches of Asheville want to be a part of the discussions that need to take place. Our prayers for peace and justice must lead to action. We are pleased to join with others around the country for this conference.

#### Deficit Situation Continues

Pledge receipts through the end of November totaled \$311,642 compared to projected pledges of \$322,604. Considering all income sources, income for the first eleven months totaled \$374,932; while we projected income to be \$407,983. We ended November with a negative variance in overall projected income of \$33,051.

The negative income variance for the first eleven months was offset by expenses in these months which were less than budgeted amounts by \$18,846. When added to the negative income variance of 33,051, year-to-date income less expenses resulted in a deficit of \$14,205 for our first eleven months.

Income this month did increase in comparison with the past several months and our shortfalls in pledged income have been reduced. Our expenses continue to offset the shortfall in income to a great extent, but we are still in a deficit situation. We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
