Parson to Person

Dear People of Grace,

I have just begun reading a book called *The Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything, A Spirituality for Real Life* by James Martin, a Jesuit priest. This book is like sitting down for a long chat with a wise but very downto-earth spiritual director. The Jesuits or the Society of Jesus are a community of Roman Catholics throughout the world who base their spiritual ideas and practice on the teachings of St. Ignatius of Loyola. What makes their practice of the Christian faith so interesting is that it is so practical. It really is a spirituality for real life. Since you

and I are living what we think of as "real life," it is an approach to the faith that is very accessible to us as well as to the Jesuits throughout the world.

Evidently, when St. Ignatius wrote his *Spiritual Exercises*, which is comparable to what some other

orders, like the Benedictines, call their *Rule*, St. Ignatius made these spiritual exercises flexible enough so that they could be adapted for all Christians, not just religious communities. If one were to describe this spirituality, it might include the following four highlights: 1) finding God in all things, 2) becoming a contemplative in action, 3) looking at the world in an incarnational way, and 4) seeking freedom and detachment.

Fr. Martin does a beautiful job of relating stories as examples to help us understand this approach to the faith. One way in which he described the first point, "Finding God in all things," was to say that God meets us wherever we are. If this is true, then in order to find God, we don't have to necessarily go anywhere or do anything special. Rather, since God meets us wherever we are while we are doing whatever we are doing, we can encounter God and God can encounter us at any time. Therefore, God desires to meet us wherever we are in everyday life.

Fr. Martin also talks about the many different ways and circumstances in which people encounter God and God encounters them. Some are looking for God. Others may have given up on the idea of the

> existence of God. Others may have had a spiritual upbringing but have drifted away from God in their adulthood. However, since God is ready and able to encounter us wherever we are, God can and will meet us in whatever state of belief or unbelief, seeking or not seeking in which we find ourselves. How wonderful

is that? What it means is that no one is beyond the loving reach of our wonderful God.

I am thinking of a Lenten reading group where we might use this book as a guide to learn and encourage one another with this very practical approach to the Christian faith. Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, which is March 1, 2017. I would invite you to take a look at this book between now and then and let me know if you'd be interested in getting together weekly during the Lenten Season and beginning to learn this very practical approach to the Christian faith together.

Pledge receipts through the end of November totaled \$314,856 compared to projected pledges of \$301,583. Considering all income sources, income received to date totaled \$390,116, while we projected income to be \$368,915. We ended the month with another positive income variance of \$21,201. Excluding the large donation received early in the year, we are still experiencing a slightly positive trend in overall income.

The positive income variance thus far was reduced somewhat by expenses which were slightly greater than budgeted amounts by \$352. When subtracted from the positive income variance of \$21,201 our income less expenses resulted in a still healthy surplus of \$20,849 thus far in the year.

While we proceeded this year in a very positive manner, we do need to be aware that a single donation has greatly influenced our financial position. We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
