Parson to Person

Dear People of Grace,

As I mentioned last month, March 1 is Ash Wednesday. The Ash Wednesday services are at 12:00 noon and 6:00 p.m. I would like to encourage you to come to one of these services, not for me, but for you. In the introduction to Lent in the Ash Wednesday liturgy, we invite one another to the observance of a holy Lent by selfexamination and repentance; prayer, fasting

and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word as ways to follow Jesus into the desert during His forty days of temptation.

For Jesus, this was a time of physical fasting. During one of my beach trip retreats a few years ago, I fasted for several days, drinking

only water during that time. What was interesting about that to me was that it was so freeing. After the first day or so, I was no longer hungry. Not having to consider what I was going to eat and/or where I was going to eat for several days was the freeing part. Think about how much time all of us spend thinking about what we want to eat, then procuring the food, then preparing it and then eating it. It was amazing not to have to think about any of that for several days.

When tempted to turn the stones into loaves of bread for him to eat, Jesus quoted Scripture to Satan saying, "Human beings do not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." That's a good thing for us to remember every day, not just during Lent. It is a reminder that we need the daily spiritual sustenance of God's Word found in Holy Scripture and enlightened by the Holy Spirit as much as we need the sustenance of our daily bread. The *Forward Day by Day* devotional is a good way to accomplish this.

Going back to my experience of physical fasting, remember how I said that

hungry? In my experience with several dear friends of mine, the same thing happened to them, not physically, but spiritually. When they drifted away from the Church and the things of God, eventually they were no longer hungry for the things of God, and in some cases they lost their faith.

ember that pops out of the fire. As long as it is in the fire, it is sustained and remains hot and glowing. But once it gets away from the fire, it grows cold and loses the heat and light of the fire. And think about this. If you take that cold lifeless ember and put it back into the fire among the other hot glowing

embers, it will reignite and regain its heat and light.

This is surely why Jesus founded the Church. The Church is the fire that sustains the heat and light of our faith. When one begins to drift away from the community of faith, one's faith begins to grow cold. And likewise, like putting the ember back into the fire, if we drift away from the Church and find that we are losing our faith, we need only to get ourselves back to the fire and the other burning embers to be reignited in the faith. Unfortunately, if we stay away long enough, having little or no faith in Christ can become our new normal. In this new normal, we may forget who we are as children of God. God may begin to seem far away or non-existent and we may become unduly distracted by the lure and cares of this world.

Lent is a time to be intentional about staying in the fire. I wish all of you a blessed, holy and joyful Lenten season as we spend some time with Jesus in the desert.

But I believe that God is not finished with me yet and that He is not finished giving me material to write about. So I felt compelled to share a wonderful tip that a friend just gave me this week. So many times when we think of prayers we think of asking for something, telling God what we need to have done, and if we receive an answer to a prayer, we rejoice and go on with our lives. I have many times wished I had a record of all the answered prayers I have received over the years. Well, here is the answer to this dilemma. When I send God a prayer request, I also need to get out a prayer journal and write the request down and the date I prayed it. If I receive an answer to that prayer, I then get the journal out and in a second column, next to the request, I write the answer to the prayer. The amazing thing is to go back after a couple of weeks and read over the requests and see how many are answered. An added bonus to this plan is that we are then able to see how God answers prayer, and how, many times, He does not answer as we expected. This little added bonus helps me refine my prayers. I now try and give God an idea of my need, but I let Him decide how to answer. After all, He is infinitely wiser than I. May you be blessed in your journal writing and the insights they provide. And if you feel led, share your experiences with me.
