Dear People of Grace,

I missed church yesterday due to a bad cold. I think I remember from French class that a bad cold is called *un* rhume abominable. Some of these respiratory viruses we're battling this year are abominable, aren't they? Anyway, I wish for all of you a healthy and happy spring!

We are now well into the season of Lent, "a time of self-examination and repentance; prayer, fasting and self-

denial," The Book of Common Prayer tells us.
How is it going for you?

...Sometimes we Psalm 23. As we shed whatever sinful behav-Just like travel on a ship, we can make course corrections at any point in our Lenten journey. So, two weeks or so, on the path, what course corrections do you and I need to make that will assist us in giving our hearts and wills more completely to our Lord Jesus?

we might see..." Maybe our course correction will have to do with relationships that are not quite right. Maybe our course correction will be getting back to a daily time of prayer and selfexamination or recommitting ourselves to study and meditation upon God's Word.

Speaking of self-examination, is it true for you, as it is for me, that sometimes we avoid self-examination because we're afraid of what we might see in our lives? Rather than really taking a good look at ourselves, we just stay busy and distracted, pushing on with life as

If that, Beloved, is true for us, it occurs to me that God has something better for us than that. We need to remember that we are safe in the loving hands of God, and from that safe place with Jesus, as He holds onto us, we can look at the unvarnished truth about ourselves.

Then, with the help of His gracious Spirit, we can repent of anything keeping us from being the loving Christlike persons we were created to be. With God's help, we can shed the anger or resentment or unforgiveness towards others or even towards ourselves. As we do so we find again those green pastures and still waters which

> we read about in ior or attitudes that are holding us back from being more like Jesus, as painful as it may be to recognize these things in our lives, we know we are better off without them. Again, God has something better for

> us in this life than that.

So, let me encourage

you, as I encourage myself, to take some time during this Lenten season, to be still before the Lord, to look inside and to consent to God's presence and God's action within us. Lent is a blessed time to look within ourselves and forsake the sin we find in our lives.

If we will do this, we can trade our sorrows, which sin always brings, for the joy that forgiveness and moving in a new and healthier direction with God always brings. It sounds like a good deal, doesn't it? And it sounds like a good deal because it IS a good deal.



Pledge receipts through the end of January totaled \$44,521, compared to projected pledges of \$29,468. Considering all income sources, income received for the year totaled \$46,553, while we projected income to be \$34,416. We ended the month with a positive income variance of \$12,137. This number should be viewed cautiously though, as we also received \$22,805 in prepaid pledges for 2018.

The positive income variance was reduced by expenses greater than budgeted amounts by \$3,287. When these overages were applied to the positive income variance of \$12,137 our income less expenses resulted in a surplus of \$8,850 at the end of January.

We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts as we begin another year.
