A Message from Fr. Gary

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

Lent begins in just a few days. During Lent we are called to not fall

victim to becoming what the world is calling us to be, but what God is calling us to be. In the not so recent past, going into Lent required that we "give something up" so that we might know the feeling, experience the pain and discomfort that our Lord experienced in the desert when faced with temptation. We have told ourselves that, by giving up something, we are better able to feel that we have done our Christian duty by suffering the lack of something that we hold dear. The fact is, I often recalled people

saying that they were giving something up that they really didn't even care for. I mean, what kind of sacrifice or hardship or temptation is that?

You may recall a film a few years ago titled "Chocolat." The film relates the story of a small French town during Lent. Everyone is trying hard to avoid rich foods, but what should open at the same time? A new and enticing chocolate shop. It is agony to walk past the shop with its velvety chocolate smells. You can't help but think that the townsfolk had missed the point especially when one of the most selfrighteous characters breaks into the shop and gorges on the chocolates inside.

Lent is not about that kind of selfdenial. There is very little value in simply giving up stuff! It's not about giving up stuff; it's about GIVING stuff — namely, the giving of your life to Christ. And how do we do that? By prayer, by time with our Lord in those

Our Lord calls us to simply do what he did, to give it all away to those who have less than us with the assurance that God's love and Jesus' presence in our lives is all that we need. precious times of silence that we make for ourselves because those times are so rich and important. It's about giving our time, talent, and treasure to our Church family and to our community. It's about taking care of the poor, destitute, marginalized, and prisoners, to name just a few. Our Lord calls us to simply do what he did, to give it all away to those who have less than us with the assurance that God's love and Jesus' presence in our lives is all that we need.

Let us not become like those who hang a wooden cross on their

wall and then settle into their comfortable routines forgetting that we are called to love our neighbor deeply, no matter whether that neighbor is rich or poor, black or white, churched or nonchurched. We are not called to blend in with those around us but to be extreme in our faith. By doing so we will be holy people instead of just nice, and God will not moan at us but will rejoice that we have heard, and we have seen, and we have embarked on our annual pilgrimage to Jerusalem with loving and faithful hearts.

May this Lent find you stretching yourselves and becoming all that God is calling you to be.

As the French would say ... Au revoir! Until we meet again. And we shall.


So ... peace, blessings, gratitude, goodbye, and Au revoir!

SCHEDULE FOR HOLY WEEK. Holy Week is the week leading up to the Feast of the Resurrection, or Easter Day. The first record of Holy Week services comes to us from a pilgrim named Egeria who traveled to Jerusalem in the 4th century. The Triduum, or "three holy days" of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday help us prepare for Easter Day! Please join us for all of these days of special observance.

The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday, April 14: "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" So begins this day of celebration commemorating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We will gather outside the church at 9:00 and 11:15 to process into the services joyfully. The tone soon turns, however, as we hear of Jesus' betrayal and crucifixion. Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday.

Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday in Holy Week, April 15, 16 and 17: Holy Week is a time of more intense preparation for the celebration of Easter. The Holy Eucharist is offered April 15, 16 and 17, at 12:15 p.m. during Holy Week to assist people in their observance and preparation.

Maundy Thursday, April 18: As a sign of servanthood, we include the washing of feet. As the liturgy concludes, the altar is stripped, and the night watch with the Blessed Sacrament begins. We ask parishioners to keep watch during the night hours remembering Jesus and the disciples at Gethsemane..."So, could you not stay awake with me one hour?" We will begin Maundy Thursday with a Seder meal at 5:30 p.m. (tickets in advance) and the liturgy will begin close to 6:45 p.m.

Good Friday, April 19: This day marks the crucifixion of our Lord. We do not celebrate the Eucharist on this day, but rather at noon we share communion from the reserved Sacrament using the Liturgy for Good Friday. The church will be open from 1:00-3:00 p.m. for those who wish to meditate on the death of Jesus during that time. At 6:00 p.m. we offer the Liturgy for Good Friday with the Stations of the Cross.

Holy Saturday, April 20: Holy Saturday is a day of rest and quiet...creation waits for Christ's resurrection. A liturgy recalling those who have died takes place in the Urban Garden at 10:00 a.m.

Easter Vigil, April 20: Discussions are continuing with the Grace Worship Committee about celebrating the Easter Vigil at Grace. Details will follow!

Easter Day, April 21: Easter Day Services at 7:45, 9:00, and 11:15 a.m. The celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord is the focus of this day at all three services as we join with hundreds of thousands of Christians throughout the world. Bring bells to ring and flowers (at 9:00) with which to "flower the cross". Church school classes will not meet and there will be an Easter Egg Hunt immediately following the 9:00 a.m. service.

From Our Senior Warden

Our Senior Warden, Greg Townsend, continues to play an important role in the transition journey we have embarked upon at Grace. His monthly reports will keep us updated and encouraged along the way.



The Vestry conducted our annual retreat the weekend of February 1-2. I have a few important items to share from our work together. First, we adopted a new organizational model for our Vestry. The **SWEEPS** model provides for two Vestry liaisons for each of the six main strands of our ministry, <u>S</u>tewardship, <u>W</u>orship, <u>E</u>vangelism, <u>E</u>ducation, <u>P</u>astoral Care, and <u>S</u>ervice, with each of our parish ministries falling under one of these strands. Obviously, this approach is going to require some adjustments in our thinking, but we believe that this structure should enable us to support those ministries of ours that are flourishing and to invigorate those that are lagging (*details on p. 11*).

One of the themes that arose during our retreat was the **Passing the Peace as a barometer of parish health**. It's funny how pews and aisles form barriers that we feel we can't overcome. Since the retreat, other Vestry members and I have made a conscious effort to "get out of our comfort zone," moving throughout the sanctuary to extend God's peace to

friends and visitors. I challenge you to join the Vestry in getting out of our comfort zones and enlivening this part of our worship.

The big news from the retreat is that we unanimously decided to combine the 9:00 and 11:15 Eucharists on a trial basis, starting on April 28 and running through September 22. One of the themes that emerged in the Holy Conversations is the need for more opportunities for fellowship on a weekly basis. It's said that when a church has multiple services it has multiple congregations. I think we can agree that that's the case here at Grace. We feel that moving from three services to two will help build this fellowship, starting with an honest-to-goodness actual coffee hour! As with all changes, the angels are in the details. The Music Director, the Worship Committee, and the clergy will work to ensure that the combined service respects the best aspects of the 9:00 and 11:15 services.

I hope you had the opportunity to attend the Holy Conversations Father Gary conducted last month. I enjoyed hearing what drew our parishioners to Grace, what they see as Grace at our best, and what they want our church to be in the future. These recollections of our communal experiences inspired many of us to consider the future we want for Grace Church. The striking thing is how many people's best memories of Grace involved a warm, friendly personal greeting or welcome. Let's build on these memories and ensure that Grace remains the warm and giving community we know it to be. *(Learn more about our Holy Conversations on p. 11.)*

Finally, I want to share what came out of one of Father Gary's exercises for us during the retreat, in which he asked each of us to rewrite one line from the Lord's Prayer. While no one is going to argue for its inclusion in the next edition of the *Book of Common Prayer*, this prayer does uniquely represent us. It is my pleasure to share this with you:

Our Trinity, Outside of this universe that is familiar to us, May we speak your name with respect and honor, May Heaven descend on us, Guide us to do what pleases You, In our world and in the cosmos. Give us what we need to get through this day. We mess up constantly, yet you forgive us; What we can't forgive is the darkness we hold in our heart, dimming our love and light. Keep us safe from all that draws us away from You. Support our resistance to unholy ways Because the world we live in, and the energy you give into it, should be used in your name for love and beauty forever.

We have faith.

New Ministry Needs

Fr. Gary has spoken about his belief for the need of two ministries: A Shepherd Ministry and a Newcomer's Ministry. No one has volunteered to lead those ministries so Fr. Gary thought he might take a few words to describe them in further detail.

SHEPHERD MINISTRY. At Grace, there is currently no structured process to receive feedback, needs, desires, etc. from our parishioners and we have no process to keep in touch with parishioners who are drifting or have drifted away. This is where the Shepherd Ministry comes in. The ministry involves a coordinator and maybe 20-25 people who are each willing to be a parish liaison for five parish families. These 20-25 people become personal liaisons from the parishioners to Grace Church leadership. By doing this we can hear concerns, respond to pastoral needs and follow up with folks we haven't seen for a while. Once a month contact is best. If you are interested in leading or heading up this ministry, please let Fr. Gary or Sr. Warden Greg Townsend know.

NEWCOMER MINISTRY: Grace has had a Newcomer Ministry in the past, but it has been dormant for a good while now. We need a Newcomers Ministry to welcome, greet, orient and incorporate visitors and guests into the life of the parish. Budget Update: December 2018-January 2019

Pledge receipts through the end of December totaled \$394,187, compared to projected pledges of \$353,610. Considering all income sources, income received for the year totaled \$419,534, while we projected income to be \$412,990. We ended the month and the year with a positive income variance of \$6,544.

Reduced expenses associated with Father Gary Coffey's retirement generated savings following his departure. These savings coupled with our positive income variance resulted in a healthy surplus. Prior to closing our 2018 fiscal year, the Vestry approved the transfer of \$23,144 to our reserve account, eliminating our surplus and closing the year with a balanced budget.

As the Vestry works to define and approve our 2019 budget this month, we gratefully acknowledge the 103 pledges committing to \$340,074 in financial support for the Parish this year. Through the month of January, we have received \$48,005 in pledges and other income while our expenses have totaled \$23,606.



Vestry Reorganization

Fr. Gary and the Vestry met for a working Retreat on February 2-3. One of the most exciting outcomes of the retreat was a reorganization of the Vestry. Over the years, it appears that our Vestry has lost its focus on being a liaison to the ministries and people of the church.

Reorganization centers on six areas: Stewardship, Worship, Evangelism, Education, Pastoral Care and Service. The Vestry is looking at all the ministries at Grace to populate each area. And finally, each Vestry member has volunteered for a specific area resulting in two liaisons per area.

The liaison's job is to be a point of contact and interface to the Vestry, a supporter and guide to each ministry and someone each ministry head can go to for resources, support, etc. Additionally, starting in July/August of 2019, ministry heads will be brought into the budgeting process so the finance committee and the Vestry know what the hopes and dreams, needs and requirements are of these ministries. This will allow Grace's budget to be "Mission Focused" vs. results focused. Below is a portion of a reorganizational chart that will be populated with ministry heads and presented in the days to come.



Transition Corner

Throughout this season of transition at Grace Church, it is important for you to know what is happening. The "Transition Corner" will help keep you updated about the latest activities over the coming months.

Fr. Gary finished his series of four Holy Conversations on Sunday, February 10. Sixty-two people participated in the conversations and shared their blessings, hopes, dreams for Grace Parish as we move forward into the next twelve months of discernment. Based on these conversations, Fr. Gary and the vestry have determined that Fr. Gary will work on four major goals during his remaining time with us. They are:

1. Educate, train, and develop a spiritual-based, fully functioning Vestry. Rather than a vestry focused only on the business of the Church, this will be a vestry also focused on the Spirituality of the Church: vision, leadership, vitality, structure, asset usage, etc.

2. Re-establish Small Groups: EfM, Alpha, Foyers, Coffee Hour, Study Groups, etc.

3. Help establish and support needed/new ministries and empower existing ministries: Shepherds, Newcomers, broaden Outreach, Youth Ministry, etc.

4. Fix Administrative and management issues: By-Laws, Policies, Procedures, Personnel, Financial Accountability, Building Use, Technology Refresh, Management of Resources, etc.

Spreadsheets of all the data collected will be posted in the foyer soon as well as posted to our website. Your ideas and comments are welcome.
