Dear People of Grace,

Our Bishop, The Rt. Rev. G. Porter Taylor will be with us for all three services on April 10 and at the 11:15 a.m. service, will

be confirming young people and adults who have been prepared for their Confirmation. A reception honoring our Confirmands will follow the 11:15 service in the parish hall. Bishop Taylor will also speak that day at the Adult Sunday School Class in the parish hall at 10:00 a.m.

You may remember that sign with a picture of Uncle Sam on it which read, "Uncle Sam wants you!" It was a plea for people to volunteer for service to our country. 
# April 3 All-Parish Potluck and Farewell Party for Becky Barker



# Gift Boosts Pledge February Receipts

Pledge receipts through the end of February totaled \$79,968, compared to projected pledges of \$54,833. Considering all income sources, income received to date totaled \$97,088; while we projected income to be \$64,550. We ended the month with a very positive variance in overall projected income of \$32,538. A generous donation of \$25,000, which was provided as pledged income, contributed significantly to this very happy month end.

The positive income variance thus far has been enhanced by expenses which were less than budgeted amounts by \$311. When added to the positive income variance of \$32,538 our income less expenses resulted in a healthy surplus of \$32,849 for the year.

While we have begun the year in a very positive manner, we do need to be aware that a single donation has greatly influenced our financial position. We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.

### The State of Our Altar Guild

Dear Grace family,

The Altar Guild is about to hit a real crisis. We have lost many members in the last several years for a variety of reasons.

We are organized into teams corresponding to Sundays: Team 1 on the first Sunday, Team 2 on the second Sunday, and so on. Whenever there is a 5th Sunday, we all pitch in. When I began serving on Team 1, our team had eight members. We are now down to three, and unfortunately, this has become typical for all our Altar Guild teams.

If you want to know what the Altar Guild does, we prepare Grace church for worship for *all* services — Sundays, funerals, and weddings, the candles, hymn boards, clergy vestments, and vessels for communion.

It has been a very rewarding experience for me. There are no finer people to work with. I miss the ladies who are gone: Angie Vest, Marty Hawkins, Betty Harper, and Sherry Coward.

Please consider joining this vital ministry. Although it is traditionally a women's ministry, men are most welcome. The preparations for Sunday services are usually made on Saturday, and don't require a long period of time. Please call me at 828-299-8412, or email me at cdoledawg@charter.net. I hope we hear from you!

I can't believe that I have already been in Panama for six months now. Half a year, and already I have seen and learned so much. With PROMESA I have had the opportunity to travel north to Santiago to work with the indigenous groups from the Ngobe Bugle, south towards Darién to work with the indigenous groups from the Emberá and the Kuna, and east to work with different rural farmers outside of the Pintada and in Tres Hermanas. I have had the opportunity to help facilitate three different farm exchanges, five different workshops, visit ten different communities, dozens of farms, and even had the chance to present with PROMESA at the National Episcopal Convention in Panama City.

But these stats really can't capture all of the inspiration that I have felt. Today, one of our agricultural promoters, Vasco, explained to me how he learned to make bread at a PROMESA "crop transformation" workshop. In these workshops, our promoters come together and share new recipes with one another that use common crops from their farms. Vasco now sells the bread that he learned to make with PROMESA to his entire community and even three of the neighboring communities down the road. He told me that he is able to send his six kids to school every day because of that bread.

Wow. I feel so fortunate to be working with an organization that is making such a big difference in the communities where it works. Thank you again for all of your support from Grace, that has allowed me to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God in Panama!



This multi-church event has been growing since the early 1990's, with Trinity Episcopal Church coming on board nine years ago. These groups of coordinators represent:

Pooling our talents, resources, volunteers and children, we can accommodate 175 children participating and well over 100 volunteers per day helping in some capacity! It is a BIG effort that pays off in a superbly crafted VBS! Our planning group of coordinators begins meeting in earnest every February to begin getting ready for the upcoming summer. There are countless hours of behind-the-scenes preparation that go on to ensure a smooth running event!

This summer, MarketPlace 29 AD (the name of our VBS) will take place from June 20-23. Registration for children and sign up for volunteers will begin this month.

Our elementary age children meet at First Presbyterian during that week, with preschoolers at Trinity.
