Dear People of God,

I find myself experiencing a little pre-vacation euphoria today. However, I don't think it's *just* pre-vacation euphoria affecting me. I think it's also an excitement about how the Holy Spirit is moving in Christendom in our day and time. I agree with Phyllis Tickle and others who say that it does seem as if something significant happens about every five hundred years in Christendom and that it's happening now. Five hundred years ago, we had the Protestant Reformation, which provided a needed rethinking of parts of the Christian faith.

At the time of the Reformation, there were some needed doctrinal changes in our understanding of the faith. One of those involved our understanding of being justified or put right with God or forgiven, not because of what we do, but through faith in Christ's atoning death for us. Partly as a result of this, Christians began to understand faith as believing certain doctrines *about* God. Consequently, there was an emphasis on believing these facts rather than trusting in God, and belief came to be understood as intellectual assent to certain propositions *about* God instead of trust *in* God.

The fresh winds of the Holy Spirit that are blowing today are leading us back in the direction of faith as trust. As a practical example of this, think about the Nicene Creed. The way we say it, "I believe in God the Father, I believe in Jesus Christ and I believe in the Holy Spirit," sounds to us like intellectual assent, and of course, it is fine to give our intellectual assent to these assertions of the Creed. But, and this is the *critical but*, our faith takes us much deeper than that. Our faith is about putting our trust in this God.

It would probably help us integrate this by saying the Creed this way, "I put my trust in God the Father, I put my trust in Jesus Christ and I put my trust in the Holy Spirit." What this does is underscore the fact that our faith is *relational*. It is about our relationship to God as a personal entity who loved us first and who now loves us in return. It's not about just believing facts *about* God. Rather, it is about a loving relationship *with* God and actually being *in* God.

It is about trusting Jesus and following Him in our lives.

Christianity is a religion, but more importantly, it is *a relationship with the living God*. It is that, Beloved, which makes all the difference. It is about proclaiming the Good News that God

came to earth in the person of Jesus to show us the very face of God. And guess what? What we saw in Jesus was love, and it's the kind of love that all human beings desire somewhere deep inside them. Why? Because we were all created in the image and likeness of that God. We yearn for the love that the Holy Spirit brings to us through Jesus and our relationship with Him as we follow Him in our lives.

We nurture our relationship with God by following Jesus in our lives and by employing certain practices to do so. The practices of the Christian faith such as worship, prayer, study and service keep us centered in our God and allow God's goodness to be imparted to us by the Holy Spirit. "Thank you, God, for always bringing us fresh understandings of our relationship with you through your Holy Spirit. AMEN."

Your Help Keeps Camp Henry Affordable

Camp Henry must improve emergency exits in the dorm and must obtain a better rescue boat. They would like to construct a footbridge across the river to connect the climbing tower area to other camp facilities and to make crossing the highway safer. The boathouse needs to be painted. The pool table is in need of repair. The Camp Henry wish list also includes dodge balls, tennis balls, frisbees, golf discs, canoe paddles, life jackets, art supplies, glow sticks, recordable DVD's first aid supplies, brooms, dust pans, mops, vacuum cleaners, window air conditioners, a truck, vans, golf carts, school supplies, gift and gas cards for staff and more. If you would like to donate any of those items, you may bring them to the church or you may contact Camp Henry for pick-up. Camp Henry would also like to give scholarships to campers who need assistance. They have received a grant that will help provide full scholarships for 20 campers from disadvantaged backgrounds, and they expect to grant at least \$85,000 in scholarship assistance this year. The goal for the Camp Henry Fund that helps with other expenses is \$50,000.

Slow 2nd Quarter Start

Pledges for April, the beginning of the second quarter, were \$21,977 or \$8,023 under budget resulting in a year-to-date pledges shortfall of \$10,785. Total April non-pledged offerings, open offerings and prior year pledges were \$5,613 or \$374 over budget resulting in a year-to-date shortfall of \$318. When combined with Building Income and all Other Income, total April income was \$8,760 under budget. At the end of the first four months, total income was \$134,966 or \$13,909 under budget.

Due to lower than anticipated Parish and Operational needs, total April expenses fell \$891 under budget reducing the total monthly bottom line to a shortfall of \$7,869. Year-to-date expenses are \$144,195 or \$4,680 under budget bringing our year-to-date operating shortfall to \$9,229.

In order to provide for future budgetary needs, it is our hope contributions will increase to meet them.
