Dear People of Grace,

I have exciting news! For the last year or so, I have been working with several other Episcopal clergy to form an Asheville Area Episcopal Youth Ministry. The problem has been that, other than the two larger congregations in town, our other Episcopal parishes have neither the number of young people nor the resources to carry on a viable youth ministry.

I am elated to report that three of our larger area congregations — St. James in Black Mountain, St. Mary's, Asheville and Grace — are pooling

our financial resources to hire a full time Youth Minister, Jenna Sharrits, to oversee and run this area-wide Episcopal youth ministry.

Like our own Elly Withers, Jenna, who has just graduated from UNC Asheville, is a wonderful success story for the Episcopal ministry in our Diocese. Active in the youth group at her own parish, she grew up as a camper

going to Camp Henry and is now the Assistant Director at Camp Henry this summer.

Our Vestry met and interviewed Jenna at the April meeting. We were very impressed with her as she spoke of her experience in youth ministry and her ideas about this new venture God is bringing about among us. Jenna is a thoughtful young woman who not only has the leadership skills and gifts to lead a group of young people, but is gifted in connecting with each young person individually. After meeting with her, your Vestry voted

unanimously to fund our part of bringing Jenna on board.

The Vestry has been funding capital projects from the proceeds of our Endowment Fund for the last few years. This year, the Vestry does not think there is a better use for these funds than to kick off this new Asheville Area Youth Ministry which will benefit not only our young people but the young people of other smaller Episcopal congregations as well.

Jenna will begin her new position August 1. She will rotate through each of the Episcopal congregations

that are a part of this ministry on Sunday mornings. She will also plan youth programming which will begin in September after Labor Day. You can look forward to seeing Jenna at Grace on a Sunday morning sometime after her August 1 start.

If you are the parents of young people in grades 6-12, we hope you will get them to Jenna's weekly Youth Group meetings as often as possible. We know

that a Youth Ministry program has been responsible for helping teenagers enliven their faith in Christ and find their places in the Church. Many of us are active Christians and members of the Church today through the influence of such a ministry. So, please add Jenna and her work to your daily prayers. We will look for God to do great things through this critical new ministry in the weeks and months and years to come.



Ordinary Time Is Not So Ordinary



You can find a chart similar to this on the bulletin board in our Altar Guild Sacristy. It tells Altar Guild volunteers what color to use for vestments and altar linens in each season of the church year. Now, during Ordinary Time, our vestments and linens are green.

If it is not the season of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter in the church year, it is sometimes referred to as Ordinary Time. As you can see on the chart to the left, Ordinary Time (in green) takes up a large portion of our year, including the period of time we are in right now. Taken from the word "ordinal," Ordinary Time simply means counted time. As you will see in your Sunday bulletins, we are currently numbering the Sundays, i.e. the First Sunday after Pentecost, the Second Sunday after Pentecost, all the way to the Last Sunday after Pentecost, right before the start of Advent. We are counting Sundays.

The liturgical color associated with Ordinary Time is green. Green has long been linked with new life and growth. It is a reminder to us that, quite literally, in the midst of ordinary time, we are given the opportunity to grow. Only when the hustle and bustle of Advent, Easter, and Lent has calmed down can we really focus on what it means to live and grow as Christians in this ordinary time in this ordinary world. It is a time to nurture our faith with opportunities for fellowship and reflection. It is a time to feed and water our faith with chances for education and personal study. It is a time to weed and prune our faith, cutting off the parts that may be dead and leaving them behind.

As Christians, we need this kind of time for growing, and with Ordinary Time, God has given us most of the church year in which to do it.

Healing Prayer Corner

Did you know that Grace Episcopal Church is known locally as a church that provides healing prayer? We are very lucky to be able to receive healing prayer at many services and through the Order of St. Luke (OSL) Chapter which meets at Grace.

When I use the term healing prayer it does not necessarily mean that a person has to be ill to receive healing prayer. Our Lord listens to all prayers. Many of our most powerful prayers do not involve physical healing. They might be prayers of thanksgiving. There are so many good things that happen in our daily lives and we many times forget to thank God for providing them. Is your child having a birthday? Bring him or her up for a birthday blessing prayer. Do you have a sick pet at home? We will pray for your furry friends. Do you have a friend or family member who is ill? Let us pray for them.

So when do these prayer times take place? Probably the most visible happens on Sunday morning at each of our three services, beginning at the Eucharist and lasting until church is over. We pray for people as they leave the rail after taking communion. We also have two

services that happen each week. On Tuesday night, the Order of St. Luke sponsors a healing service beginning at 6:30 p.m. As an added bonus, on the first Tuesday of each month, the service is also a Generational Healing Service. Through prayer, we can break the chains of past generations which are passed down to us. We can also use that time to thank God for all the blessings He has bestowed on us. The other weekly service is on Wednesdays at 12:15 p.m. with a Healing Prayer Service, Eucharist and laying on of hands for God's healing. Grace also has a monthly Taizé service, held on the third Sunday of each month at 8:00 p.m. It is attended by an ecumenical congregation who enjoy the reflective form of worship using candles, incense, chants, meditative readings and prayers. Healing Prayer is also offered at this service.

In addition to all of the above, Grace is privileged to have the Order of St. Luke offering prayer when you attend its monthly meetings held the second Thursday of all months except June, July and December, 6:30-8:30 p.m. OSL offers a time for learning about Healing Prayer and a time at the end of each meeting for prayer. They will also offer individual prayer with two prayer ministers. These sessions are set up at your convenience. Ann Robinson coordinates this service and she can be reached at 828-274-3462.

Pledge receipts through the end of April totaled \$139,187 compared to projected pledges of \$117,870. Considering all income sources, income received for the year totaled \$148,011, while we projected income to be \$137,663. We ended the month with a positive income variance of \$10,348.

The positive variance in income was offset somewhat by expenses which were greater than budgeted amounts by \$1818. When these overages were applied to the positive income variance of \$10,348 our income less expenses resulted in a surplus of \$8530 at the end of April.

We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
