### Parson to Person

Dear People of God,

Here we are once again, Beloved, in those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer! It occurred to me today that the word "recreation," when broken down, is "re-creation." Therefore, true recreation should involve a re-creation of our beings. My hope for us all this summer then is to be re-created or revitalized in such a way that we find the rest and wholeness that God has for us. In fact, as we consider our

choices of recreation this summer, we might do so with that in mind. What are the activities that will really bring us life?

Certainly, experiencing the beauty

of God's Creation is one way to be revitalized. I may have mentioned to you that someone I read suggested that we should purposefully seek out places where we can see nothing that is human-made on a regular basis. I was reminded of this last week when I was riding my bike out at Bent Creek. I was struck again with the beauty of that place and the sounds and smells of nature. Incidentally, we are planning a worship service outside at beautiful Lake Logan for Sunday, August 25th at 11:00 a.m. Mark your calendars now!

St. Paul talks about coming to faith in Christ as a new creation. "If anyone is in Christ," St. Paul says, "that person is a new creation. Old things have passed away. Behold, all is new." Those of us who have been Christians for a long time may have forgotten what it is like to experience the new creation in Christ. Indeed, those of us who came up in the faith as children may never be able to remember a time when we were not "in Christ" and a part

of that new creation.

For others, who came to Christ later in life, that time when all things changed and became new may have been more dramatic. I'll bet that most of us have walked with Christ for so long that we cannot conceive of the emptiness of life without Him.


### Rummage Sale Update

## Grace Outreach Notes

EPISCOPAL HABITAT HOUSE - MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY. The Grace Outreach Committee is looking for someone who would be willing to lead our participation in the building of the Episcopal House X for Habitat for Humanity. The committee has already set aside funds to meet our financial obligation for the house. Therefore, no fundraising would be involved in the project. This year's house will be located in Swannanoa. Construction will take place between October 22 and mid-January. Grace will be asked to provide volunteer labor for several days during that time period, and finding people to work will be part of the ministry. There are also some organizational meetings that take place before construction begins. More than one person could serve as co-chair for the project. SWANNANOA TRANSITIONAL HOUSING. This past May, many of you who attend the 9:00 service were privileged to hear music performed by the "Voices of Hope" choir from the Correctional Center for Women. You may be interested to know more:

Ninety-five percent of incarcerated women in North Carolina have experienced physical, mental or sexual abuse prior to incarceration; have had previously undiagnosed or untreated mental illness; have no family support during their incarcerations, or their families and friends are why they turned to crime in the first place.

For those reasons, they cannot go home. The lack of suitable safe housing for those women is a barrier to successful re-entry into society after they are released from prison. The Swannanoa Valley Transitional Housing Committee offers safe housing and supportive resources to help these women make successful re-entries into society. # Feast Day of St. Mary Magdalene

The Episcopal Church celebrates the feast day of St. Mary Magdalene or Mary of Magdala on July 22. Mary has been called the second-most important woman in the New Testament after Mary the mother of Jesus. She traveled with Jesus as one of his followers, and she was present at Jesus' two most important moments: the crucifixion and the resurrection. Within the four Gospels, she is named at least twelve times, more than most of the apostles. The Gospel references describe her as courageous, brave enough to stand by Jesus in his hours of suffering, death and beyond.

In the New Testament, Jesus cleansed Mary Magdalene of "seven demons," sometimes interpreted as referring to complex illnesses. Mary was most prominent during Jesus' last days. When Jesus was crucified by the Romans, Mary Magdalene was there supporting him in his final terrifying moments and mourning his death. She stayed with him at the cross after the male disciples (except John the Beloved) had fled. She was at his burial, and she is the only person to be listed in all four Gospels as first to realize that Jesus had risen and to testify to that central teaching of faith.



Also celebrated in July, the feast day of St. James the Apostle, July 25.

## Dear Mrs. Rudd



Theda Rudd, age 43, passed away on Wednesday, June 5, at Mission Hospital. A much-loved member of Grace, Theda was also a teacher at Asheville High School. In her work, she touched many young lives, as was evidenced when family, friends, colleagues and students gathered at Grace on June 10 to celebrate her life. The following was written by one of those young people, and because it so beautifully captures the joy and energy with which Theda lived her life, we wanted to share it with you.

Dear Mrs. Rudd, I don't remember the last time I saw you Or the last words we shared together But if I had known, I would've told you that you did more than teach me how to find myself between the wrinkles of an old and stubborn language More than teach me to listen carefully to the cracked spines of books And see blank-pages as eyes given to us to better see God You did more than relieve the growing pangs of peer pressure that traveled through your door You taught me how to live like each moment is summer See, when you took the scars of a double mastectomy And saw them as lilacs blooming in the door-yard of your heart You showed me what it meant to be an optimist Because every moment that cancer lived in your body you had every right To want to burn the world for growing, as you withered But you didn't, you let each moment spread like shamrock seeds. And watched as they broke, burst and

blossomed into firework finales of green Even as winter grew in you You lived in an endless summer You knew that the only place you could stop cancer from growing was in your soul That if you kept moving forward, the cancer in your footprints would never penetrate the calluses you'd built around your soul You knew that it was your choice to wrap yourself in warm breezes as you did to be blown down by callous winds You showed me that, even though you couldn't control the duration of your life, You could control the quality of it You taught me to hold onto this moment To wrap my fingers twice around today But never break eye-contact with tomorrow It was the first day of summer when winter *claimed* your body You gave us your soul so that it could spread in us like shamrock seeds And you could watch as we break, burst, and blossom into firework finales

You were more than just a teacher to me, You were a friend And with all my heart, I will miss you.



# **Healthy May**

A refreshing May resulted in over-budget pledges of \$3,374. That positive variance brought year-todate pledges to \$7,411 under budget, down from \$10,785 under budget for the first four months of the year. Non-pledged and open offerings were close to budget and brought the month's total contributions including pledges to \$3,070 over budget.

When combined with building income and all other income, total May income was \$3,070 over budget. Total parish expenses for the month fell \$6,925 under budget because of the timing of needs. That positive expense variance, when combined with May's positive income variance, resulted in a total positive variance of \$9,995 for the month.

Year-to-date total income was \$175,254 or \$10,839 under budget and total expenses are \$174,489 or \$11,605 under budget resulting in net year-to-date income of \$766. Going forward, as expenses come due, it is our hope that contributions will be in line to meet them.
