Parson to Person

Dear People of Grace,

I am writing this month about the importance of our Children's Sunday School program here at Grace. When we baptize a child, the parents and godparents are asked to make vows regarding the spiritual wellbeing of the child that are similar in importance to the vows that two people make when they are married These vows are stated as the answers to the following

two questions: 1) Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life? and 2) Will you by your prayers and witness help this child grow into the full stature of Christ? To both these questions, the parents and godparents answer, "I will, with God's help."

Bringing the child up in the Christian faith and life and

helping the child grow into the full stature of Christ involves at least these three things:
1) teaching the child the Christian faith;
2) living the Christian faith in front of the child; and 3) praying for the child as he or she is formed in the Christian faith.

Years ago, the Church changed the term "Christian Education" to "Christian Formation." Of course, there is an educational component to it. We must teach our children the tenets of the faith, what we believe and why we believe it. But, in order for them to be formed or better yet, *transformed* into a Christian, into the image of Christ, we must put them somewhere where this formation or transformation is likely to take place. A primary place where that happens for young children 3-11 years of age is in Sunday School on Sunday mornings.

With a large enough group bound by camaraderie developed through their younger years, middle school and high school age children may continue to attend Sunday School. Diocesan gatherings also often provide this critical mass of young people in an atmosphere where middle school and high school children are touched by Christ through camp, conference, and service opportunities.

But, fulfilling the vows we made when we baptized our little ones *starts* in Children's Sunday School and, hopefully, will continue through adulthood.

The teachers in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program are meeting and working hard to be ready to receive your children this fall. I am going to switch from Adult Education this year and will be teaching fourth and fifth graders downstairs in the classroom across from the Conference Room.

Those of us teaching Children's Sunday School need one thing from you parents. We need you to bring the children to us at

around 10:00 a.m. each Sunday morning when you are in town. We will do our best to help you keep your vows to God about seeing that your children are brought up in the Christian faith and life. BUT, and this is the "critical but," we can't teach them if they are not there.

So, I am asking you on behalf of our Lord Jesus Christ to give your children the gift of bringing them to Sunday School each week that you are able and we will do our best to help them on their journey to grow into the full stature of Christ.

God continues to bless my hike in so many ways, but this week was very special. We arrived in Millinocket, Maine, on Tuesday afternoon with a chance of rain forecasted every day for the rest of the week. One forecast showed the least chance (40%) on Thursday, and I was thinking that should be the day to climb Katahdin. We went to the Baxter State Park Headquarters to find out about making parking reservations and they were about to close at 4:00 p.m., so they couldn't give us much help and asked that we come back on Wednesday morning at 8:00 a.m. As we went outside, a lady who had been standing in the office (angels come in many shapes and forms) came out with us and told us that we could go to the park the next day if we wanted to, and that the weather would probably be better on Wednesday. She let us know that if people who have reservations for parking don't show up by 7:05 a.m., the gatekeeper will start giving away the unclaimed spaces on a first-come basis.

We had nothing to lose but a couple of hours of sleep, so we decided to take a chance the next morning and go. All that could happen is that we wouldn't get in, and we would go back the next day with a reservation. We got up early on Wednesday and drove out to the park. It just happened that we arrived in the line at the gatehouse a little before 7:00 a.m. As the few cars in front of us were being checked in and allowed to pass with their reservations in hand, we made our way up to the gate, looking all the while at the sign that said all parking lots were full. When we pulled up to the gatehouse, I explained to the gatekeeper what my hiking plan was and where I needed parking spaces. She looked at her list and at her clock, and said, "Well, it is now 7:05, so it looks like I can give you some open spaces we have." Then she filled out a permit card for us, looked at the Maine license plates on our rental car (it is a \$14 entrance fee for non-Maine residents, as determined by car registration) and let us pass through with no fees at all charged. I was able to do my planned hike from one side of the mountain to the other, with Beth driving to the other end to pick me up, and the weather stayed perfect all day, with only a little sprinkle of rain as I was coming down the final stretch of trail. I got great pictures and had one of the most memorable hikes of my life. God certainly works wonders if you trust and believe.

Ministry Schedule "Glossary"

Each monthly issue of the Grace TEAM includes a full-page "Ministry Schedule" for the month.

For those of you who serve in these ministries, it's important to check this schedule carefully and maybe even stick it on the refrigerator as a reminder. For those of you who don't serve, but may have wondered about some of the titles, abbreviations and acronyms, here are a few explanations you might find interesting.

- Acolyte C: The acolyte who processes in and out carrying the cross; this person also holds the Bible for our Deacon when she reads the Gospel lesson.
- Acolyte G: The acolyte carrying a candle (also called a torch) on the Gospel or left side of the church if you're facing the altar.
- Acolyte E: The acolyte carrying a candle on the Epistle or right side of the church facing the altar.
- L, I, P: The Lector reads the lessons; the Intercessor leads the Prayers of the People; the Presenters process to the altar with the bread and wine for the Eucharist.
- Chalicists: The Chalicists administer the wine at Communion.

Also on our Ministry Schedule, you'll find volunteers for the Healing Team, Ushers, Coffee Hour, Counters and Depositors, Flower Arrangers and the Altar Guild. All these ministries are important to the life of Grace Church and are so meaningful to those who serve. Thank you to each of you.

Pledge receipts through the end of June totaled \$190,214 compared to projected pledges of \$164,500. Considering all income sources, income received to date totaled \$235,929; while we projected income to be \$201,227. We ended the month with another positive variance in overall projected income of \$34,703. We continue to experience a very positive trend in overall income.

The positive income variance thus far was reduced somewhat by expenses which were greater than budgeted amounts by \$1590. When subtracted from the positive income variance of \$34,703, our income less expenses resulted in a still healthy surplus of more than \$33,112 for the year.

While we are still moving in a positive direction, we continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
