Dear People of Grace

As you probably know, Grace Church is entering an "In-Between" time in our history.

Fr. Coffey has retired, and so, from now until a new Rector is in place, we will be involved in a time of discernment.

In the fairly near future, we expect to be joined by an Interim Rector who will round out our ministry team.

Trust me, this is going to be a good and exciting time for us! I believe God has a way of energizing and inspiring us at pivotal points such as this in the life of our faith communi-

ty. And, I have no doubt that we will emerge from this "In -Between" time not only with a new Rector, but also with a renewed vision of who we are as a parish and a fresh grasp of who and what God wants us to be.

Dear People of God at Grace,

I have never felt so loved by a congregation as I did on July 15th in your midst. My heart is breaking as I think of each of you. It is VERY difficult to leave, though I know that it is the right thing in my life and in your life as a parish. When one has a long tenure as a Rector, the great temptation is to stay too long. When that happens, often the ministry goes into decline because the Rector has lost the spark of energy that it takes to do things to the best of his or her ability. At a deanery meeting several years ago, I told the clergy and our then bishop, Porter Taylor, who was there, that I wanted to finish strong at Grace. Since that time, I have tried to do things to enhance the ministry in such a way that, when I needed to walk away, y'all would be as strong as possible and ready to embrace new leadership. Fr. Ron Haines, an early mentor of mine, told me before I went to seminary that the job of the Rector is to make the congregation so self-sufficient that he or she will be gone several weeks before anyone notices! I love that and have thought of it often in my years in ministry. So, I hope around Labor Day weekend, y'all will be saying, "What happened to Gary? When did he leave?"

My tenure as Rector among you has been a sacred trust that God and you gave me seventeen years ago. I have treasured your sacred trust in me and am now handing back that sacred trust for you to bestow upon your next Rector. My advice to you for the search is to make it a spiritual quest, and look for a person who loves Jesus. I think that the process that Augusta has described to us is such a quest. Know that I will be praying for y'all like crazy because the way I feel about entrusting you to someone else is very much like I felt when my daughter Kristin was about to be married.

Astrid and I are OVERWHELMED by your generosity. The signed picture of Grace helps me feel like I am taking you with me. The prayer shawl is comforting to me in my grief. The beautiful icon is your deployment of St. Michael, the Archangel, to watch over Astrid and me. The pen is something that I will use every day to remind me of you. The book Kristin put together will be for reading and remembering. The bundle of cash is being set aside for some travel that we hope to do out West to some of the National Parks like Glacier, Yellowstone and Yosemite. So, thank you, thank you, thank you! As I said in my homily on Sunday, "You know that I love you, and I know that you love me, and that love, we will hold in our hearts... always".

A Dios! To God with you, Beloved Ones of God!


Fr. Gary

Parish News, Updates & Reminders

VERGER MINISTRY. For the past several months, our clergy, including our Bishop, along with our Vestry and other members of the laity have been preparing to begin a Verger Ministry at Grace Church.

In our Anglican Tradition, a Verger is a lay person within the parish who assists the clergy in worship. Most of what the Verger does is "behind the scenes" and would include such things as opening and securing the church facility, locating and placing bulletins and other items prior to worship, making sure the Altar Book is marked and the readings are available and serving as a "gofer" for the clergy during worship. Primarily, the Verger relieves the clergy of looking after liturgical detail so the clergy can concentrate on their duties to preach the Gospel and administer the Sacraments.



The basic vestment of Vergers at Grace Church will be a black cassock. Over the cassock, the Verger may wear a sleeveless gown known as a chimere. In procession, at Grace Church, the Verger will precede the clergy and will carry a wooden staff known as a Virge which signifies the office. Vergers are appointed by the clergy, and four persons have been selected to begin this ministry at Grace: James Cannon, Chip Coon, Lorie Tola and Daphne Urquhart. They will be installed in August. Please support them in this ministry as we strive to provide quality liturgical experiences and worship opportunities here at Grace.

NEW ADULT LECTIONARY BIBLE STUDIES BEGIN AUGUST 5. Great news for those of you who enjoy studying the Bible and talking about our Lectionary lessons for each week! On Sunday, August 5, we will be launching our new Adult Lectionary Bible Studies Class (LBS). The class will be held in between the first and second services from 10:15 to 11:00 a.m. in the parish hall.

In LBS, we'll discuss all three lessons assigned for the week. Doing this will help us deepen our understanding of God's Word, incorporate it into our daily lives, and strengthen us to serve our Lord.

Each week, we'll start with a prayer and hear the overall theme for the assigned lessons. Then, you'll hear the context for each of the three lessons, read them aloud, and have the chance to share your thoughts, insights, and inspirations.



Pledge receipts through the end of June totaled \$199,778 compared to projected pledges of \$176,805. Considering all income sources, income received for the year totaled \$212,764, while we projected income to be \$206,495. We ended the month with a positive income variance of \$6,269.

The positive variance in income was offset by expenses which were greater than budgeted amounts by \$6,549. When these overages were applied to the positive income variance of \$6,269 our income less expenses resulted in a deficit of \$280 at the end of June.

We continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
