Parson to Person

Dear People of God,

As you might guess, I am always on the lookout for ways to advance in our spiritual lives and in our relationships with God. In my preparations for an adult Sunday school class which will begin on September 8, I came across an approach that I think will be of value. The class, to be held in the conference room downstairs, is called Guarding Your Child's Heart and was developed by Dr. Gary Smalley, a well-known Christian psychologist who has **Guard your** written many books heart for it is about love, parenting and family life. the wellspring of life.

As Dr. Smalley describes it, he had done so well for so long, he had started to "believe

his own press," which is always dangerous. Then, at age 62, he had a serious heart attack that got his attention. The result was, as I understand it, that he discovered he might not be as great and wonderful as he had thought he was! His psychologist son introduced him to a method of scriptural reflection and meditation that he says has changed his life.

What it involves is, for lack of a better way of describing it, hiding God's Word in our hearts. The way he did that was to write a verse of Scripture on a three-by-five card and carry it with him throughout the day, taking time to read it and to think about it whenever he had a chance. In his experience and in the experience of others with whom he has worked, that simple approach has helped them to be more centered in God and to overcome, or to begin to overcome, many of the "besetting sins" in their lives. Besetting sins are those problems such as greed, selfishness and lust that we may have tried to overcome in our lives but that we have been unable to

I think there may be a number of

categories we could use for those besetting sins, but the four Smalley has identified are just fine. They are pride, lust of the eyes (love of the world), lust of the flesh (selfishness), and ungratefulness. Smalley maintains that all those temptations and sins we face can be categorized in one of those four beliefs or harmful practices. The way we overcome those four negative beliefs is by developing the four positive

beliefs that oppose them: humility over pride, loving God over loving the world, loving others over selfishness, and thankfulness over ungratefulness.

You can think of the heart as having two

paths, the path of those four fear-based negative beliefs and the alternate path of the four love-based beliefs. As the thousands of thoughts we think daily come into our minds, we build up the love-based side that becomes our "default setting." We learn to walk the way of that love-based side, exercising those four love-based beliefs: humility, love of God. love of others, and thankfulness. 
Beloved, I am inviting you to walk that journey with me for the next four months, each month coinciding with one of the four love-based beliefs. Weekly, we will receive cards with verses of Scripture to strengthen those beliefs in our hearts. No classes to attend — just carry the card and look at it and think about it six or seven times during the day. Doing that for a week will hide each of those verses in our hearts. "Guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life" (Proverbs 4:23).


Monday Soup Suppers Return

ROOM IN THE INN (an update from Terri

Frue). This year (our third!), we will host Room In the Inn October 13-19 at Grace. and we are blessed to have help from The Church of the Holy Spirit. They will take on half the week, sharing all the responsibilities with Grace.

For those of you new to this program, there will be twelve women staying at Grace each night with the option for a thirteenth if there is a need. The women will arrive around 6:15 each evening for dinner. They will stay overnight at the church along with two volunteers. Each morning they will rise at 6:00 and will leave for downtown around 6:30 or 6:45. We will provide a quick breakfast and send them off with bag lunches. My hope is that hosting RITI will continue to be a very rewarding experience for us at Grace, as we can witness firsthand the fruits of our efforts to better the lives of the ladies of our community who are being assisted through this program.

A sign-up sheet will be posted for volunteers. Each day, we will need two overnight people, twelve bag lunches, dinner for each evening, and someone to pick up the ladies each evening and return them downtown each morning. We will also need basic supplies such as milk, juice, bread, fruit, etc.

Other big needs are zippered pillow covers and soft new or used blankets. You may also donate money to help us purchase these items. We will then store them for use when we host RITI again. Mattresses are provided and are transferred from church to church. Planned Giving & Endowment Fr. Alex Comfort

Did you know that August is National Wills Month? I didn't know that either, but it is. I do know that many Americans (over 60%) have not made their wills yet. Our Rector Gary is supposed to ask every parishioner to make a will, especially each couple after they have their first child. If we choose not to make wills, then North Carolina has made them for us. They are slow and complicated and will drive our heirs crazy before all is done. For most of us, the wills get done when we find the circumstances right: when we become parents, before we book plane flights for vacations, when our spouses absolutely demand it. We need to review our wills every three to five years once we make them. And we'd like for you to consider adding a gift to Grace Church when you do that. Please ask the Endowment Committee for details, and please allow us to speak with you about how that might be done. No pressure, just information.

Wonderful News from Our Grace Endowment Fund! A benchmark has been achieved as our FUND has surpassed the \$300,000 level. We received \$150 in new gifts in July and \$750 in the first seven months of the year. Our Parsec Management Firm has achieved a gain of \$12,263 for the month and an overall gain of \$37,932 for the seven-month period of time. At the end of July we had a balance of \$300,588.17. That is wonderful news. We have excellent management of our fund and a few parishioners sending in new gifts. But we cannot expect the stock market to continue to rise, so please consider what you can do to memorialize or recognize someone, or simply give what you can to add new money to work to reach our \$500,000 GOAL.

Positive Start for Second Half

July was a refreshing month with Pledged Income of \$31,307 (budget \$30,000) and Non-pledged of \$5,915 (budget \$4,240). When combined with Open Offerings, Building and other Income, July's total income was \$39,733, resulting in a positive variance of \$2,514. Year-to-date income totaled \$255,599 or \$4,932 under budget. This negative variance is primarily due to a shortfall in Pledge Income and Open Offerings.

July's total expenses were \$45,385, resulting in a negative variance of \$8,166. Most of this is due to the \$6,150 spent on the masonry and stone work and the quarterly insurance and pension costs. Because of the timing of budgeted costs, year-to-date expenses at the end of July were \$5,926 under budget for a total spent of \$254,606. When combined with the negative income variance of \$4,932, our year-to-date net income is \$993 over budget.

Budgeted expenses to be paid in the remaining months of this year total \$192,018. We are prayerful all needs will be met with continued contributions.
