Feeding Hungry Children The Grace Outreach Committee has a long-running program, the

The Grace Outreach Committee has a long-running program, the Grace Back-Packer program, that provides food "packs" to children in need at neighboring Jones Elementary School. The children are identified by the school as those who are eligible for free breakfast and lunch at school during the week, but who may not have access to adequate food on the weekends.

Since the children at Jones are young, carrying one large, heavy bag home each week is too difficult. For this reason, we send smaller, lighter weight bags twice a week. (Managing the weight of the bags is also the reason we request smaller sizes of food when we occasionally ask you to donate to this project during the school year.)

So what keeps this program running smoothly? Volunteers keep track of our food inventory at Grace and place special online orders for food from MANNA Food Bank when we run low.

We then have a team of people who take turns picking up pre-bagged food each Thursday at MANNA and bringing it to the church; these same pick-up people also bring our special orders to the church as needed.

In addition to the bags we receive from MANNA, another team of volunteers meets late Thursday afternoon in the Grace kitchen to pack supplemental bags for the second Jones delivery.

Lastly, volunteers deliver the food to Jones Elementary on Thursday afternoons and again on Monday mornings. The school distributes the bags to the students.

Thank you for your prayers and your continuing support as we strive to help provide food to children who are hungry in our own neighborhood.

- To join the packing team on Thursday afternoons at the church, contact Carol Booth, 658-0339, or Kim Hayes, 645-4906. Although the weekly time commitment is not large, regular participation for the entire school year is helpful. With enough packers, we could possibly institute a rotating schedule.
- If you can deliver food to Jones, contact Carol or Kim. For parents with children enrolled at Jones, volunteering to deliver might be a convenient way to help out, especially for the Monday delivery.

Adult Sunday School: Spirituality and the Twelve Steps

"AA." "NA." "Al-Anon." "Alateen." "Nar-Anon." "ACA." What do all of these have in common? They're examples of "12-Step" groups, and many of them meet at Grace Church throughout the week. The essential principle of 12-Step groups is the role "a Higher Power" plays in helping individuals heal and address the problems facing them. Come join us between the 9:00 and 11:15 services for our first adult Sunday School course of the academic year, starting Sunday, September 11 and running through October 23, facilitated by Greg Townsend. Through studying Richard Rohr's *Breathing Underwater: Spirituality and the Twelve Steps*, we'll explore the scriptural and sacramental connections with the 12 Steps and how each of us can use them to heal and to deepen our own personal spirituality.

Sunday School: Through the Lens of a Child's Perspective

When my two boys began attending Sunday School at Grace three years ago, I took the opportunity to enjoy some free time with friends at Edna's from ten to eleven every Sunday morning. Eventually it occurred to me that my sons had every right to question how important Sunday School really was given my choice to socialize instead of attending myself. That's when I began attending Sunday School.

Very shortly thereafter, I decided to attend a presentation on what the children were learning in Sunday School because I realized I had no idea what was being taught or how it was being taught in their Sunday School classes. I have learned through volunteering in my children's regular school classes that my children see how much I value their education when I take an active role in it. I also have seen their self-esteem boosted by my taking an active interest and participating in volunteering in their classes on a regular basis.

So although I was initially hesitant to volunteer in their Sunday School classes, I realized there was nothing more impactful that I could do to teach my children how much I value their Sunday School education. I also began to realize it was another opportunity to spend time with them in a unique setting.

What I didn't expect is how much I would learn in the classes! When I attended Georgia Tech, we often bragged that we were not just learning facts and data, but we were learning critical problem solving skills, which, if you believe the popular bumper sticker, is "the other national deficit." I found the method used to teach the children allowed them to critically think about the information being presented, have space to form their own ideas and opinions, hear others' interpretations, and ultimately be gently guided by their teachers to consider the Truths behind our spiritual teachings.

It is a respectful, engaging, and kind process that teaches our children far more than facts and data about the Bible. I can only imagine the impact on our children if not just every parent, but every member of the church, took advantage of supporting our children by taking an active role in their Sunday School education by volunteering. Not only will it enrich our children's experience, but it can also enrich our own experience as we revisit Bible lessons through the lens of a child's perspective.

Pledge receipts through the end of July totaled \$215,713 compared to projected pledges of \$191,917. Considering all income sources, income received to date totaled \$265,964, while we projected income to be \$234,764. We ended the month with another positive variance in overall projected income of \$31,200. We continue to experience a very positive trend in overall income.

The positive income variance thus far was reduced somewhat by expenses which were greater than budgeted amounts by \$2,226. When subtracted from the positive income variance of \$31,200, our income less expenses resulted in a still healthy surplus of more than \$28,974 for the year.

While we are still moving in a positive direction, we continue to encourage prayer and attention to our stewardship efforts.
