A Message from Fr. Gary

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ,

Lent has begun. The special liturgy in *The Book of Common Prayer* for Ash Wednesday says:

"I invite you... to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and

repentance; by prayer, fasting, and selfdenial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word."

Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking stock of many things—our lives, our priorities, our weaknesses, our strengths, our ideals—and identifying what is most important.

Lent originated in the early Church as a preparatory time for Easter, when the faithful rededicated themselves and when converts participated in the Catechu-

menate and were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. By observing the forty days of Lent, the individual Christian walks with Jesus as he withdrew into the wilderness for forty days. All churches that have a continuous history extending before AD 1500 observe Lent. The ancient church that wrote, collected, canonized, and spread the New Testament also observed Lent, believing it to be a commandment from the apostles.

Because Sunday is the day of the Resurrection, we skip over Sundays when we calculate the forty days of Lent. Therefore, in the Western Church, Lent always begins on Ash Wednesday, the seventh Wednesday before Easter. In many countries, the last day before Lent (called Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday or Carnival) has become a last celebration before the solemnity of Lent.

During Lent we will offer three Christian Formation opportunities: (1) At the Monday morning Bible study, Father

Bob will bring a Lenten focus to the readings: sacrifice, confession, fasting, etc. (2) On Sundays at 9:30 we will watch a video series called A Spring in the Desert, offering "a Lenten journey inspired by the many passages of scripture that use images of water in the desert as a sign of the healing and wholeness that come through God alone. To this they add the distilled wisdom of the Desert Mothers and Fathers and the surprisingly rich inspiration of the plants and animals that

thrive in an arid land. Along the way, they will share the ways our faith speaks to the barren places in our lives and how those times of drought can be a source of strength." (3) On March 14, 21 and 28, 6-8:00 p.m., Katie Warren will guide us on an art adventure where we will engage the Lenten readings through Lectio Divina, chalk pastels and collage as we receive a fresh word of God revealed only to us. A donation of \$10 is asked to offset materials.

I hope to see all of you throughout Lent as we prepare ourselves for the glorious day of Easter.

Three Lenten Programs

LENTEN JOURNEY 2020. Explore the Lenten readings as we creatively engage the Scriptures through the practice of Lectio Divina. We will use chalk pastels and collage to visually represent a "fresh word from God" received by each individual in the hearing of the Scriptures. What will the art look like? It is a mystery how God uniquely comes to each person in the hearing of the Word and in the creative process. The creations may not look like something that represents our notion of Lent. That is the way God surprises us—by appearing in ordinary ways. Jesus the King was born in a stable—not as people expected. As our hands busy themselves with chalk and paper, we do not know where we will go—it's an adventure with God. Prepare to be surprised. See a sample in the parish office. Join Fr. A SPRING IN THE DESERT. On Sundays, at 9:25 in the parish hall, during Lent, come with us to the desert through a video program. It is that place of silence, solitude, and quiet surrender where we look for God's transforming power. Our guides are Frank and Victoria Logue, who use scripture, ancient wisdom, imagery, and personal insight to deepen our faith. Our desert journey examines the Seven Christian virtues of purity, moderation, charity, diligence, patience, kindness, and humility. Here is our road map: (1) Introducing the Desert and the Virtues, (2) Purity and Moderation, (3) Charity and Diligence, (4) Patience and Kindness, (5) Humility and Practice.

This online curriculum is a companion to the Logue's book, *A Spring in the Desert: Rediscovering the Water of Life in Lent* by Frank and Victoria Logue, published by Forward Movement.

The Holy Eucharist will be offered at 12:15 p.m. during Holy Week to assist people in observance and preparation.

April 9 — Maundy Thursday: THE LITURGY OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

There will be a Seder meal at 5:30 p.m. (see page 5); the liturgy begins at 7:00 p.m. and a Night Watch will be held from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. A Night Watch sign-up sheet will be posted in the foyer.

April 10 — GOOD FRIDAY LITURGY

At 12:00 noon, we will share communion from the reserved Sacrament using the Liturgy for Good Friday. The church will be open from 1:00-3:00 p.m. for those who wish to meditate on the death of Jesus. At 6:00 p.m., we offer the Liturgy for Good Friday with the Stations of the Cross.

April 11 — HOLY SATURDAY WORSHIP

A liturgy recalling those who have died will take place in the Urban Garden at 10:00 a.m.

April 11 — THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER

The Great Vigil is the first celebration of Easter. It begins at 8:15 p.m.

April 12 — EASTER DAY: THE SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION

The celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord is the focus of this day at both services, 8:00 and 10:30 a.m. Bring bells to ring and flowers (at 10:30) with which to "flower the cross."

FROM OUR JUNIOR WARDEN. Dear People of Grace, we here at Grace have been given an historic building and grounds to care for. Our building is 100+ years old. The grounds contain several trees much older than the building. It is our responsibility to care for what GOD has given us, and the current committee of six needs some help.

We have recently had an accident involving the barrier wall at the corner of Merrimon Avenue and Ottari Road which will require rebuilding. We are working toward getting that rebuilt at no cost to the Parish. On January 19, our heating and air conditioning system

in the basement of the Sanctuary failed. It is currently being replaced but at a cost of \$16,000 +.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee consists of myself and five other members of Grace Church. We know there will be a considerable number of projects that we would ALL like to see accomplished this next year, but the number of projects we expect exceeds the ability of this Committee to accomplish them. This means that without additional man / woman power, we will not be able to keep up with routine maintenance, let alone any additional requests for work around the Church. If you have a specific skill set, please volunteer. And, of course, there will always be multiple projects where the only skill set needed will be your presence and willingness to help.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee requests a prioritized list of projects members would like to see completed this year as well as a list of those willing to work along-side the Buildings and Grounds Committee to help us complete these projects. Please give the above your thoughts and prayers and help us provide the attention needed/wanted by this Parish to care for what GOD has provided.
