# A Message from Rev. Milly

A budget can be defined as an estimate of income and expenditure for a set period of time. And that is, of course, accurate. But for us as a community, a budget is also a map of our hearts. "Wherever your treasure is, there also will be your heart."

As Christians, we are called to love. Therefore our budget is much more than a set of numbers; our budget is the foundational guiding map of where we intend to set our hearts—the path that we as a community intend to take, in order to love.

The work that goes into setting our hearts on this path of love is part business and part theology. Setting a budget is a work of discernment, prayer and action. As your vestry goes into retreat (October 17, 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. at Kanuga) please pray for us. Pray that we are so moved by our calling to love our neighbor as ourselves that we build a map our congregation's heart will be eager to follow.

And we thank you, for the prayers and for the pledges – it is because you pledge to Grace, to steward our community, that we have the resources to create this map of our hearts. For over 115 years, Grace has been upheld and stewarded well by the people who call this place their Spiritual Home.

We have goals this year at Grace, to empower generations to come—goals that will help us build a map that gets us to where our hearts long to go.


One of our goals is to increase our annual pledges from families and individuals from 105 to 125. Just 20 additional pledges can make the difference for our journey together toward that place of love. We also have the goal of increasing our pledge total by 10%. This means an increase of about \$35,000. Additionally, we have the goal of increasing pledges from our younger congregants. Currently only 5.5% of our giving comes from congregants under 40, and only 13% from folks 40 -50. And while these numbers correlate with average ages of membership, we are growing with new members under the age of 60 and thus we hope our pledges reflect that growth!

If we are to be sustainable and manage our resources well, the more we can share the responsibility, the healthier and more effective we can be. Thank you, Grace. Thank you for being about Stewardship, not only in this season, but in every season of the life of Grace and the life of Church. Our hearts are set on this path toward love—let's journey in joy together.

**PURLS OF GRACE.** (a note from Beth) I hope this finds all our Knitters and Crocheters well. Purls of Grace is a ministry that gives handmade shawls, lap robes and hats to people who need a hug. I find handwork helpful in fighting boredom and have made several shawls during the last few months. Please consider filling some of this downtime with a shawl project. A simple 20" by 60" rectangle shawl can be a great comfort to a lonely, sick or troubled person. This could be a project



for your child or grandchild just learning to knit or crochet. Imagine three 20" by 20" granny squares made by three different family members and sewn together. We have a lot of yarn and patterns, so please call me if you need yarn, ideas or instruction. YouTube is also a great source for instruction. Google "prayer shawls" and you will find lots of free downloadable patterns,

For the past few years, I have led the effort to get shawls made, and Jeanne Robertson has been identifying people who are in situations where a shawl would be a comfort. She writes sweet notes to go

with the shawls and gets them delivered. Now, Jeanne is stepping down to prepare for a move to Florida, and I need someone to take over that side of the ministry. EfM CLASSES RESUME. EfM Classes for the current class of six participants are on Thursdays at 6:00 p.m. via Zoom. This class has survived through the challenges of starting a new class/program (recruiting, mentor training, registration, etc.) and the COVID-19 pandemic! Please read more about EfM and plans for new classes starting in January.



Educate Yourself for Ministry Through EfM. EfM is a comprehensive, four-year program sponsored by the School of Theology at the University of the South. It's geared for providing the participants a better understanding of the Christian Tradition, the Bible, our Church History, and being a Christian in today's world.

Year One of the program is about the Old Testament and Year Two covers the New Testament. Year Three focuses on Christianity/Church History. Year Four is an integrative year that covers Anglican ethics, living in today's world as a Christian, and continues the process of our personal and global theologies as Christians. EfM is not a straight Bible Study. You can find out more details about the program, curriculum, and readings for all four years at the

website: <a href="http://efm.sewanee.edu/">http://efm.sewanee.edu/</a>.

Nancy Walters and Chris Jaquette are the Co-Mentors for the Grace EfM group. Chris was trained on campus in Sewanee to be an EfM Mentor during Summer 2019, and Nancy just completed her Mentor training online via Zoom from a Sewanee trainer in July.

A new class will be starting in January 2021. Most or all of the current class will be continuing and moving on to the Year Two curriculum in January, so we would like to encourage new members to join and bring the group up to 10-12 members.

We urge you to learn more about EfM by looking at the information on the Sewanee website, and then talking with Nancy, Chris or current/former EfM class members or graduates of the program.

Also, to accommodate everyone's busy schedules and today's transitions, you don't need to attend the course for four straight years. You can take one year at a time and you can also take time off between the classes. We will decide in September and again in January 2021 how we will hold classes (in person or virtually) based on guidance from the Bishop, the CDC and participants' preferences.

Please consider joining this enriching fellowship and personal growth program at Grace!

ROOTED. Growing into who God created us and calls us to be begins by being Rooted: Rooted in faith, rooted in Jesus, rooted in family, rooted in community. This being "Rooted" is what allows human-beings to gain a sense of belonging and worthiness and it is from that place that we, as humans, have the ability to love and serve our neighbor and God.

Our "Rooted Ministries" will encompass our outreach to new families, our welcome of new families and pastoral programs for families, including the building again of the Youth Program.

# Prayerful that a Positive Trend will Continue

After eight months of 2020, we have received pledged income of \$229,627, and income from all sources totaled \$297,758. Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of June 2020 totaled \$241,728 and were

\$15,130 less than those forecast in the budget approved by the vestry in their June meeting.

The approved budget includes a small deficit, \$4758.25, but thus far in the year we are experiencing a surplus. The surplus is largely attributable to the receipt of our Paycheck Protection Program loan of \$34,900 and several one-time gifts received early in the year coupled with savings resulting from our limited operations.

The current health crisis has not yet affected our financial situation adversely. Parishioners have been generous through August and our expenses have been restricted with our confinement. We prayerfully hope that this positive trend will continue as we all adapt to a new normal.
