Greetings from your new Senior Warden!

"Get used to different."

Those words come from a New York Times article by Peter Wehner that came out this past Christmas Eve entitled "The Forgotten Radicalism of Jesus Christ." I've been sitting with this piece for the past few weeks, imaging what is in store for Grace Church over the upcoming year.

The article examines what 1st Century Christians were facing as they set out on their journey following Jesus. They had mostly been indoctrinated in conventional religious and cultural teaching. Then, along comes Jesus, with his radically inclusive ways of teaching and dealing with the people he encounters. Those early followers were caught off-guard by Jesus' embrace of the Samaritan woman at the well, as described in the Gospel of John, who had had five husbands and was now with a man who

was not her husband. Rather than judge her or cast her out, Jesus showed her dignity and respect, transforming her into a powerful messenger of Christ's teachings.

The theme of this story permeates Jesus' story. He touched lepers, healed the paralytics and the blind, people thought to be unclean and unworthy. Even to his dying breath, he sought to spread God's love by telling the thief on the cross next to him that, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

Jesus connected with outcasts not only to relieve the pain and lift their shame, but also to benefit society as a whole. He modeled the behavior that he wants us to follow, and so that we can see God ourselves as our redeemer and our source of comfort and grace.

I believe that God sent Rev. Milly to us to help guide us on our journey to change the lives of those in our community who need God's Love the most. Her life experience and ministerial focus has always been on making a difference for the less fortunate, the broken, the forgotten. God has truly blessed us here at Grace Church. Now is the time for us to align our sensibilities with those of the radical and radically inclusive Jesus, about whom Rev. Milly preaches, and who we find in our hearts when we look for him.

I'm so excited to be called upon to serve in this role as your Senior Warden, and I can hardly wait to see what lies ahead!



Palm Sunday. The service will be aired March 28, 10:30 a.m. on YouTube.

Holy Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Since the 16th Century, the Seven Last Words of Christ have been a central focus of Good Friday and Holy Week Liturgies. This Holy Week at Grace, we will explore the Seven Last Words of Christ on Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday and Holy Wednesday, March 29, 30 & 31. Theses reflections will be aired on YouTube at 5:00 p.m. each of these evenings.

Maundy Thursday Liturgy. The April 1 liturgy will be aired on YouTube at 5:00 p.m.

Good Friday. A 12:00 noon service will be aired on YouTube; a 5:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross service will also be aired on YouTube.

Holy Saturday Liturgy. This service will air on YouTube at 8:00 p.m. Each congregant will be given a basket for this service that includes bells, a candle and a bulletin. Information on pick-up at the church will be announced at the end of March.

Educate Yourself for Ministry Through EfM

Grace Episcopal Church attendees, members, and member friends are invited to join the Grace Church Education for Ministry (EfM) class.

Last year's class managed (4 of the 6 participants) to finish off the first year of EfM. Now, this was quite a challenge due to the pandemic, but it happened! We became a close-knit group and were able to help each other through thick and thin and learned a lot. So, we want to keep on going and welcome others to join the class.

Here are some details about EfM (Adult Formation):



The program is sponsored by:

- Grace Episcopal Church, Asheville, and the Diocese of Western North Carolina
- Aided with funds that have been donated to the Rector's Discretionary Fund

About the Education For Ministry Program:

- ♦ 4 Year Program (year=36 classes/weeks) of Adult Christian Formation
- ◆ Developed & administered by the School of Theology, University of the South (Sewanee)
- ◆ See: https://efm.sewanee.edu/ It explains the program, the curriculum, books, study/classroom discussion, etc.
- Year 1 of the program is about the Old Testament and Year 2 studies the New Testament. Year 3 focuses on Christianity and Church History. Year 4 is an integrative year that covers Anglican ethics, living in today's World as a Christian. NOTE: EfM is not a straight Bible Study.
- Cost \$ 375 per student per year for sponsored classes (our class is WNC Diocese sponsored). The Grace Rector's Discretionary Fund for this coming class will be able to subsidize up to 10 students with \$ 200 per student.

The EfM Class will be held: Face2Face and Virtual

- F2F will be in the Parish Hall at Grace Church. This can be done safely with up to 8 people if we sit at tables at least 6 feet apart, wear masks, bring our own snacks, and help clear up the tables & chairs/sanitize them/put them away after class. Bring your own snacks/beverages, mask, and clean-up wipes.
- Virtual meetings will be on ZOOM and will happen at the same time.
- Day of Week Thursday or Friday evenings (or Saturday or Sunday?) We cannot hold EfM Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday evenings because the Grace ZOOM account is in use for other groups/ programs.

In 2021, the EfM Year is 36 weeks long.

We propose to run EfM from the Week of February 15 through the fourth week of June, then off some for the summer, and then run from the last week of August through December 16.

We will negotiate the time off at Easter, summer, federal holidays, & Thanksgiving as the group desires.

OUTREACH. Steadfast House Update. The Ministry of providing meals to the ABCCM Steadfast House is in transition. Meal Teams from Grace have been providing a monthly meal to residents and their children for many years. As Steadfast House prepares to move to Transformation Village (located in West Asheville) it is anticipated that our role may change as residents become settled in their new location. However, volunteers will still be needed to assist in providing meals, or in aspects of meal preparation. The new location may also provide other opportunities that are not yet known at this time. Historically, the Steadfast House ministry has consisted of teams that take turns providing the monthly meal. Recently, with the delayed transition to Transformation Village and COVID precautions, meal teams, church members, and the Outreach Committee have been providing donations to cover the cost of catered food for that monthly meal. As the new direction of this ministry becomes clearer, please stay tuned for how to participate. This is a face-to-face and family friendly ministry, which we hope will continue in the new location.



Asheville Strong is a local agency that has been on the Grace Outreach radar for many months now. Its "Feed Our City" program not only partners with local chefs to provide up to 1500 meals a week to those in need; it also sustains independent restaurants and farmers by keeping them at work. As their founder Catherine Campbell said, "We follow the need."

Recently, Asheville Strong reached a major milestone: they have injected over \$100,000 back into the local econo-

A Note from Consider Haiti

<u>Pumpkin Patch.</u> Some good news. For the majority of 2020, Consider Haiti was not able to fully fund their programs. It's easy to dehumanize with terms like "not fully fund" but the reality is stark. We don't distribute as many goats or water filters. We don't treat as many malnourished kids or provide the same educational opportunities for families. Children in our communities suffer when we can't make the budget. That said, we just sent our 2021 first quarter transfer to our colleagues in Haiti and funded at 100%. Grace Church and the Pumpkin Patch rockstars are a key reason we were able to achieve this goal. Pumpkin by pumpkin, we do make a very positive impact in Haiti. Thank you so much. *Mesi anpil! Bon bagay!*

<u>Update from the Episcopal Public Policy Network</u>



ACTION ALERTS

A grassroots effort of The Episcopal Church's Office of Government Relations (OGR) to educate, equip and engage individual Episcopalians in federal public policy advocacy from a faith-based perspective using trustworthy information.

The first 100 days of a presidency do matter. A new Congress and new Administration present The Episcopal Church with the opportunity to highlight our values and speak up for the way we think our country should be governed. We will continue to engage on areas where the Church has spoken, including:

- <u>Creation Care</u>: In recognition that loving God and our neighbor includes caring for God's creation and the environment where our neighbor lives, OGR advocates for policies that protect the natural world and promote a healthy, clean, and safe environment for all. Advocacy includes greenhouse gas emission reduction, a just transition away from fossil fuel energy, and safeguards to protect clean water and air.
- Racial Reconciliation: OGR challenges policies that perpetuate systemic racism and injustice and strives to change legislation that continues to harm Black and Indigenous communities and other communities of color.
- Ending Poverty: OGR advocates for policies that will eliminate poverty and help people live with dignity, both in the U.S. and internationally.
- <u>Immigration and Refugees</u>: We advocate for comprehensive immigration reform through policies that respect the dignity and worth of every human being. OGR works to protect the human rights and safety of refugees by supporting the refugee resettlement work of Episcopal Migration Ministries and advocating for robust refugee resettlement policies.
- Human Rights and Peacebuilding: The Church supports legislation and policies that protect human rights and prevent atrocities, promote gender justice, and build peace. OGR partners with non-U.S. Episcopal dioceses and provinces throughout the Anglican Communion to work towards justice.
- We will also push for an ambitious response to the COVID-19 pandemic, including accelerating vaccination for the most vulnerable and helping to encourage the general public to take the vaccine following guidance from public health experts.

2020 Closes on a Positive Note

After twelve months of 2020, we have received pledged income of \$346,329; and income from all sources totaled \$418,189. Administrative, Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of December 2020 totaled \$417,885 and were \$29,760 more than those forecast in the budget approved by the Vestry earlier in the year.

The approved budget included a small deficit, \$4,849, but we have successfully closed the year with a surplus. The surplus is largely attributable to the receipt of: additional pledges received late in the year; our Paycheck Protection Program loan of \$34,900; several one-time gifts received early in the year; and transfer of funds from savings from our prior year operations. Forgiveness of the PPP loan was approved by the Small Business Administration and subsequently by First Citizens Bank in late November, and we will not be required to reimburse any part of it, providing a substantial cushion this year.

We have closed the year on a very positive note given the turmoil we have seen this year. Parishioners have been generous and our expenses have been restricted with our confinement. We prayerfully hope that this positive trend will continue in 2021.
