

THE NEW TESTAMENT READING 1 Corinthians 6:12-20



Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen



EDUCATE YOURSELF FOR MINISTRY THROUGH EFM

Grace Episcopal Church attendees, members, and member friends are invited to join the Grace Church Education for Ministry (EfM) class.

Last year's class managed (4 of the 6) to finish off the first year of EfM. Now, this was quite a challenge due to the pandemic, but it happened! We became a close-knit group and were able to help each other through thick and thin and learned a lot. So, we want to keep ongoing and welcome others to join the class.

Here are the details about EfM (Adult Formation):

- 1. Sponsored by:
 - a. Grace Episcopal Church, AVL and the Diocese of Western North Carolina
 - b. Aided with Funds that have been Donated to the Rector's Discretionary Fund

2. Education for Ministry Program –

- a. 4 Year Program (year=36 classes/weeks) of Adult Christian Formation
- b. Developed & administered by the School of Theology, University of the South (Sewanee)
- c. See: https://efm.sewanee.edu/ It explains the program, the curriculum, books, study/classroom discussion, etc.
- d. Year 1 of the program is about the Old Testament and Year 2 studies the New Testament. Year 3 focuses on Christianity and Church History. Year 4 is an integrative year that covers Anglican ethics, living in today's World as a Christian. NOTE: EfM is not a straight Bible Study.
- e. Cost \$ 375 per student per year for sponsored classes (our class is WNC Diocese sponsored). The Grace Rector's Discretionary Fund for this coming class will be able to subsidize up to 10 students with \$ 200 per student.

3. EfM Class will be held: Face2Face & Virtual.

- a. F2F Will be in the Parish Hall @ Grace Church This can be done with up to 8 people if we sit at tables at least 6 feet apart, wear masks, bring our own snacks, and help clear up the tables & chairs/sanitize them/put them away after class. Bring your own snacks/beverages, mask, and clean up wipes to use.
- b. Virtual + On ZOOM at the same time.
- c. Day of Week Thursday or Friday evenings or Sat or Sun? We cannot hold EfM on Mon-Wed evenings because the Grace AVL ZOOM account is in use for other groups/programs.

4. EfM Year – 36 weeks long – 2021

- a. We propose to run EfM from the Week of February 15^{th} thru to the end of June 4^{th} week, then off some of the summer, and then run from the last Week of August through December 16^{th} .
- b. We will negotiate the time off at Easter, Summer, Federal Holidays, & Thanksgiving as the group desires.

- c. Minimum class number is 6 (Counting the 2 mentors if they are registered students too, maximum is 12.)




register or even email her, just show up! The Bird Sanctuary parking lot is located just past the library on Merrimon Ave.
