

Construction is continuing at a steady pace for our new roof. Right now, shingles are being removed from the Sanctuary so that all necessary repairs and upgrades can be addressed and new shingles and materials can be installed.

Meanwhile, contributions from our parishioners are starting to take a vacation at a time when the invoices from the construction company are coming due. The good news is that the Diocese favorably received a presentation from members of the Vestry for a \$25,000 loan, which is scheduled for review and approval at the end of this month. Howev-



er, the heat is still on for us to raise the rest of the funding for our new roof.

### Our Ongoing Legacy

STILL A LOT OF GOOD WORKS TO BE DONE. Thinking about our "Raise the Roof" campaign put me in mind of something I read in "Windows of Grace," the story of our stained glass windows. The story goes that children collected pennies to help pay for the windows. This was when a few pennies could put substantial food on the family table. The Good Shepherd windows were installed in 1940, and the church was soon to be consecrated, as it had taken the congregation over thirty years to pay for its construction. The war years would soon follow; more lean times when mountain life was already mighty lean compared to the rest of North Carolina. So lean, in fact, that a friend of mine, born and raised in Madison County, told me mountain folk never really felt the Great Depression. The local markets and communities were meager but self sustaining. They all had jobs — helping each other stay fed and clothed and warm in the winter. These are the folks on whose shoulders we stand today.

The work we are having done today is another chapter in the ongoing legacy of Grace Memorial Episcopal Church. The word "Memorial" is often omitted from the church's name. But step into the sanctuary and look around at the pews, tables, alter pieces; so many are dedicated in memorial. Donations by those with means who were able to honor their dear departed ones. It gives me pause to think of all the folks whose names are not engraved on a polished plate. Folks coming and going through our sanctuary for over a hundred years, whose names we will never know. Generations of humble folks who would spare a few coins regularly for the offering plate. The entire sanctuary is a memorial to them.

So now it is our turn. We were blessed to have funding to contribute, and we have received generous donations and grants, but we still have a good sum of debt. And with any debt it is always better to get out from under that burden as soon as one can, as it weighs one down, keeping one from moving on to other good works. And at Grace Memorial Church, there are still a lot of good works to be done.

Your gift will preserve the legacy and honor those whose good works have brought us this far, ensuring that our descendants, and many others we will never know, will have this beautiful church to gather in for another hundred years. Thank you for your contributions.

### From Our Sr. Warden (in St. Maarten)

Dear Good People of Grace,

Cate and I were fortunate to spend a week with her parents at their timeshare on this lovely Caribbean island. On Sunday morning, before we headed out for a rum-soaked afternoon on the pool deck, we were treated to a double dose of "YouTube Episcopalia," watching Cate's brother preach at his church in Lake Wales, Florida, followed by the live

stream of our service in Asheville. The scripture for both services was the same, with the Gospel reading from Mark that references the mustard seed, which got me to thinking about where Grace is in our spiritual journey.

Though the specific reading from Mark refers to a mustard seed, I like to think of an acorn as I meditate on this passage. The acorn, planted in the ground, is out of sight, out of mind. Then, all of a sudden it pokes its head up through the soil as a sapling. At that point, it has all of the DNA and biology of an oak tree, but it's not yet in the form that we consider to be a tree. We could pull it out by its roots or run it over with the lawnmower like a weed.

Ór instead, we could nurture it. Water it. Feed it. Mulch around it. If we put in that labor and provide that care, through God's love, that sapling will grow into a mighty oak.

Grace Church is like that little sapling. Maybe a little more mature and sturdy than one that has only recently broken the surface of the soil, but surely not as strong or as tall or with roots as deep or branches as broad as we know God wants us to be.

Our church needs our efforts and our attention to grow a stout trunk, strong branches and deep roots. We will soon have an Associate Priest to help Rev. Milly, as Paul writes in Ephesians, "to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith in the knowledge of the son of God and become mature."

We as a Vestry have made strategic plans to budget for that Associate Priest position in a sustainable way, so that Christ's light will continue to burn even brighter at our little church on the hill, and so that we can extend our outreach even further into the community in which we live and serve. We hope that you will prayerfully consider how you can support the mission and ministry of Grace Church through your time, talent and treasure.



CHILDREN'S TRANSITION ROOM. As we resume in-person worship at Grace, we are thoughtful about your needs, your children's needs and our desire to be together again. We realize that children under the age of 12 have not yet been offered an option of vaccination; therefore, being in a large group may not be an option for your family.

We are also very aware that, for children, a year of not being at Grace is a long time. Therefore, the habit and comfort of being in church has perhaps lessened. We want that habit and comfort to be built back in a sustainable and fun way that

equips your children to gather again at Grace for worship and fellowship with confidence.

Therefore we are offering something new for your unvaccinated kids on Sundays — a special "Transition Room" in the parish hall. There, you can watch the service live-streamed and still remain socially distanced. Each child will be given an activity backpack that can be found in the foyer as you enter the parish hall. In the pack, your child will find age-appropriate books, crayons, clip board and coloring sheets. In the "Transition Room," your child can be active, engaged with worship and their activity pack, enjoy snacks and move about as you are comfortable.

Our hope is that this will build their resiliency, capacity and joy for church again, slowly and intentionally. And yours too.

Again, this is an offering, and of course you and your children are welcome to get activity packs and come on into the sanctuary as well! It is your choice how you regather. We simply want you to have options in this process because we know...it is a process, and we want it to be successful. Feel free to call or email Rev. Milly if you have any questions.

### Grace Outreach: What Can I Do?

What can I do to be the hands, feet, eyes and voice of Christ in a suffering world? Too old, too busy, too burdened with my own problems, how can I advocate for those who struggle every day to find shelter, put food on the table, provide for their families? Just one individual in the midst of so many in crisis, what can I do to make a difference?

Actually, <u>so</u> much! All together, as the Grace Church family, we really can "collaborate in realizing the kingdom of heaven on earth through seeking and serving Christ in all persons, respecting the dignity of every human, and striving for social justice and peace." Let's make it a vision we all share.

THANK YOU AGAIN, PEOPLE OF GRACE! Your generous gifts of hygiene supplies for people without houses being sheltered right now in two local hotels have already been a big help. And since then, the outreach team has used a portion of a recent financial gift to make those donations go even further.

Meanwhile, our first "cookout" with these hotel residents resulted not only in great meals for all, but also in the beginnings of new friendships. By the time this issue of the "TEAM" is published, we will have hosted our second meal with our new friends. We're looking forward to it.

Thank you to all who grilled burgers and hotdogs; whipped up potato salad; made baked beans; provided drinks, paper products and condiments; and prepared all those delicious desserts. Thanks, too, to those who helped set up, serve, take down and spent time visiting. It was a blessing for everyone.

SUMMER HEATS UP DEMAND FOR ABCCM'S HEATING AND COOLING ASSISTANCE. When I was a graduate student on a tight budget, writes Doug McClellan, I lived in a rental mobile home. Living conditions were fine in the winter, spring, and fall, but the summer was brutal because the air conditioner didn't work. Every day was like living in a beatdown from hell. The one window fan gave little relief, and the blower in the central heater stayed on all the time. I called the landlord often, but my calls went unanswered.

Sadly, many of our friends, neighbors, and families here in Asheville are living in similar, life-stifling conditions today. Single moms especially, who are the wage earners and care givers, are facing the the hard reality of both paying the rent every month and living in the heat. ABCCM's Crisis Ministry is helping as many folks as possible with rental and cooling assistance (window air-conditioning units and fans) and rental/mortgage relief, but they need our help in taking the heat off a growing number of underserved families. FOSTER KIDS NEED SCHOOL SUPPLIES. Could you donate a box of crayons or a note-book or pencils for youngsters headed back to school this fall? Or what about a gift card to assist a teenager headed off to college? This year, Grace Church will once again collaborate with the Buncombe County Foster Care Foundation to provide supplies for approximately twenty young people in foster care settings, kinship settings (where there is no financial support) or post adoption. This year, that number includes three young adults who are starting college. Thank you, as always, for your generous gifts to these kids. Donations will be accepted at the church from July 25 to August 8. More details to come.

A NEW LOOK AT REPARATIONS . "For more than a century, the Virginia Theological Seminary relied on the forced labor of Black Americans. Now the seminary is sending annual cash payments of \$2,100 to the descendants of those people. It's one of the first cash reparations pro-

grams in the country, and it's meant to recognize the Black people who worked on campus for little or no money during the time of slavery, reconstruction and Jim Crow..."

# **Budget Report for May 2021**

After five months of 2021, we have received Pledged Income of \$151,997, including prepayments for the year. Income from all sources totaled \$190,539, largely as a result of retained earnings from the prior year. The amount is less than last year's \$222,585 Income at this time.

Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of May 2021 totaled \$146,702 and was \$15,518 less than those forecasted in the budget adopted by the Vestry. This difference is due to expenses less than the amount budgeted in all but Personnel, as social distancing remained. Expenses are expected to increase as the church reopens.

The approved budget included a deficit of \$25,619, and the Vestry is hopeful that this will be reduced as the year progresses. As programs and offerings expand, we anticipate greater participation and involvement in both the spiritual and financial life of the Parish. In the event that our optimism isn't rewarded, at present we do have sufficient reserves to adequately cover this possible shortfall.

The 2021 stewardship effort has provided \$315,540 of the \$385,000 goal. This amount is more pledged monies than had been received at this time last year. We anticipate this trend to continue as Grace attracts new members and we all look forward to reopening the church. We are prayerfully hopeful that this year will be a bountiful one as Grace grows.
