Greetings from Rev. Mike

To the people of Grace,

Wow! I am so grateful and filled with excitement to be writing you all as Associate Rector here at Grace. In so many ways, I have felt the Holy Spirit at work in the process that has brought me here. As I met with Rev. Milly, discerned, and listened to the stirrings of my spirit, it became increasingly clear that God was calling me to come and join with you at Grace. Each time I joined in for church, preached, or presided with you all, I was struck with the sense that something truly exciting is happening here. Through the passion of the congregation and the leadership of Rev. Milly, this felt like an ideal environment to learn and grow in my identity as an Episcopal priest.

I hope that we may evolve together in my role here at Grace. Though I will have many functions, I will place particular focus on our work in pastoral care and outreach. It is my greatest hope that in our time together God will do just this. In ways both grand and ordinary, with discernment and hard work, may we beckon the kingdom of God a bit closer in our own hearts and in our world. I look forward to beginning this work together come August 15. Until then, you are all in my prayers, and I hope that I am in yours.

CHILDREN'S TRANSITION ROOM. As we resume in-person worship at Grace, we are thoughtful about your needs, your children's needs and our desire to be together again. We realize that children under the age of 12 have not yet been offered an option of vaccination; therefore, being in a large group may not be an option for your family.

We are also very aware that, for children, a year of not being at Grace is a long time. Therefore, the habit and comfort of being in church has perhaps lessened. We want that habit and comfort to be built back in a sustainable and fun way that

equips your children to gather again at Grace for worship and fellowship with confidence.

Therefore we are offering something new for your unvaccinated kids on Sundays — a special "Transition Room" in the parish hall. There, you can watch the service live-streamed and still remain socially distanced. Each child will be given an activity backpack that can be found in the foyer as you enter the parish hall. In the pack, your child will find age-appropriate books, crayons, clip board and coloring sheets. In the "Transition Room," your child can be active, engaged with worship and their activity pack, enjoy snacks and move about as you are comfortable.

Our hope is that this will build their resiliency, capacity and joy for church again, slowly and intentionally. And yours too.

Again, this is an offering, and of course, you and your children are welcome to get activity packs and come on into the sanctuary as well! It is your choice how you regather. We simply want you to have options because we know...it is a process, and we want it to be successful. Feel free to call or email Rev. Milly if you have any questions.

AN UPDATE FROM CONSIDER HAITI. You're no doubt aware of the recent assassination of the Haitian President, Jovenel Moïse. Haiti tends to make the news cycle when the situation is tumultuous. Consider Haiti is shocked and concerned by these events, but our work in Haiti continues nonetheless.



Many years ago, we determined that our ultimate goal was to put ourselves out of business. To position Haitians so that they no longer needed our collaboration. This focus on empowering Haitians has been a cornerstone of our work ever since that time.

This approach benefits us and our Haitian counterparts during times of strife. We're positioned to be beneficial from afar and our Haitian contractors are firmly aligned to operate independently.

Consider Haiti is in it for the long haul. We've seen many other organizations come and go over the years but we remain laser focused on our goals and how to best achieve them in a manner safe for all. We are ever grateful that Grace Church (and others) have also been committed to a long term relationship.

We can't predict the future for Haiti. What we can envision is our commitment to our work in Haiti and your faithful support of that work. As the Haitian proverb asserts, "Dèyè mòn gen mòn." Beyond mountains there are mountains.

FOSTER KIDS NEED SCHOOL SUPPLIES. Will you donate a box of crayons or a notebook or pencils for youngsters headed back to school this fall? Or what about a gift card to assist a teenager headed off to college? This year, Grace Church is once again collaborating with the Buncombe County Foster Care Foundation to provide supplies for approximately twenty young people in foster care settings, kinship settings (where there is no financial support) or post adoption. This year, that number includes three young adults who are starting college. Thank you, as always, for your generous gifts to these kids. Donations will be accepted in the foyer at church now through August 8.

EPISCOPAL HOUSE XIV BUILD BEGINS THIS MONTH! For the past 20+ years, several churches in our diocese, including Grace, have combined their money and volunteer efforts to build a Habitat for Humanity house every other year. 2021 marks the beginning of our 14th house in this succession. Join other members of our Grace family and other churches in the Asheville area in volunteering your time and effort to build homes and change lives on a local Asheville Area Habitat jobsite. During this build volunteers will frame floors and walls, set trusses, raise roof ladders, install doors and windows, paint, stucco and landscape. A variety of jobs will be available every day, as several townhomes are in various stages of construction, but your volunteer efforts will count toward the Episcopal House no matter where you choose to volunteer on a given day. No experience is necessary, just come prepared to work hard and have fun!

This year the recipient of the house will be Glenn Childes, who is a church sexton at Trinity Episcopal Church in Asheville. Volunteer workdays will begin on August 17 and continue through October 8. The worksite is in the New Heights development at 1793 Old Haywood Road in West Asheville.

NO HOME. NO HOPE. Imagine not knowing where you will live tomorrow. Sadly, that's the reality facing more than 32,000 families in Buncombe County right now as the moratorium on housing assistance is ending and renters, landlords, and homeowners will soon be required to be current on their payments.

Already this year, ABCCM has seen a 500% increase in rental assistance requests, despite the moratorium.

And with this, ABCCM is expecting "a crisis of tsunami-scale proportions of rent requests to inundate its crisis ministries" and predicts "this crisis will be the greatest to hit Buncombe County since the Great Recession."

### **Budget Report for June 2021**

After six months of 2021, we have received Pledged Income of \$174,785, including prepayments for the year. Income from all sources totaled \$215,393, largely as a result of retained earnings from the prior year. The amount is less than last year's \$247,178 income at this time.

Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of June 2021 totaled \$183,152, and was \$19,939 less than those forecasted in the budget adopted by the Vestry. This difference is due to expenses less than the amount budgeted in all but Personnel. Expenses are expected to increase as the church continues to reopens and due to the addition of the Tech Director and the Associate Priest.

The approved budget included a deficit of \$25,619, and the Vestry is hopeful that this will continue to be reduced as the year progresses. As programs and offerings expand, we anticipate greater participation and involvement in both the spiritual and financial life of the Parish. In the event that our optimism isn't rewarded, at present we do have sufficient reserves to adequately cover this possible shortfall.

The 2021 stewardship effort has provided \$315,540 of the \$385,000 goal. This amount is more pledged monies than had been received at this time last year. We anticipate this trend to continue as Grace attracts new members and we all look forward to reopening the church. We are prayerfully hopeful that this year will be a bountiful one as Grace grows.
