**THE GOSPEL:** Luke 21:25-36

Jesus said, "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in a cloud' with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. 
We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of life abundant.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **Amen**.







Feel free to bring your lunch with you! Advent is a time of preparation for new life to emerge. In the dark of winter we are invited into the mystical practice



of digging deep into our inner landscape to nourish our spiritual soil and our souls, so that come Christmas we are prepared to receive the living Christ and come Epiphany that revelations that grow from his light in our lives. We will explore poetry, music, and art for creating fertile soil to ground our journeys. Join us for the first three weeks of Advent! No need to register, just join us in the parish hall.


