I hope that you are feeling the same excitement that swells up in my soul when I think of the approaching Advent season. In so many ways, Advent encapsulates what brought me to the priesthood and to church itself. Perhaps more than any other liturgical season, Advent emphasizes the best parts of Anglicanism. For one, it is deeply ceremonial. For each of us, our most fundamental memories of "the Christmas season" are intimately connected to the rituals that make up the four Sundays of Advent. We feel excitement to light the Advent wreath, wait with anticipation to peel back the next window in our Advent calendar, or admire the Christmas tree and its accompanying decorations. The organ's pipes blast the tune of familiar hymns, and blue cloths adorn pulpit and altar. There is something about this season, and about these traditions, that reminds us that we are at home.

Advent also invites us into contemplation. Quiet, still, wait—all are adjectives preachers

use in Advent sermons. It is a time for patience, both as the celebration of Jesus' birth nears, and as we await the return of Jesus. Just as we practice patience, we also take spiritual inventory during this time. We ensure that we are prepared for Christ's return by tending to our spirits. As Jesus says in Luke 12:35, "Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks."

I pray that we feel a deep well of gratitude for this exciting season. I am confident that its bounties will be significant for us on our journey together as the Body of Christ. Let us sing a joyful song in our anticipation, and let us remember the words of the hymn "Lift Up Ye Mighty Gates" —

"Redeemer, come, with us abide; our hearts to thee we open wide; let us thy inner peace feel; thy grace and love in us reveal."

Yes! Our Paper Bag Pageant is Back!


CALLING ALL STARS, SHEPHERDS, ANIMALS AND ANGELS! It's the long-awaited

Budget Report for October 2021

After ten months of 2021, we have received Pledged Income of \$272,977 including prepayments for the year. Income from all sources totaled \$321,893, as a result of retained earnings from the prior year and increased payment of pledges. Due to increased expenses, we are currently in an operating deficit position.

Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of October 2021 totaled \$338,592, \$108 more than those forecasted in the budget adopted by the Vestry. Expenses have increased as the church continues to reopen and due to the addition of the Tech Director and the Associate Priest. These expenses have been countered so far by some projected expenses not materialized.

The approved budget included a deficit. The Vestry is hopeful that this will be eliminated by December with continued payment of pledges. As programs and offerings expand, we anticipate greater participation and involvement in both the spiritual and financial life of the Parish. In the event that our optimism isn't rewarded, at present we do have sufficient reserves to adequately cover this possible shortfall.

The 2021 stewardship effort provided \$315,540 of the \$385,000 goal. This amount is more pledged monies than had been received last year; currently, pledged receipts are more than projected. We are prayerfully hopeful that this year will be a bountiful one as Grace grows.
