A Message from Rev. Milly

Blessed Epiphany Dear People of Grace!

Epiphanies come to us in many ways. God makes Godself known to us over and over throughout history and in this moment. The greatest Epiphanies come when the history and the present moment intersect in a way that affirms who God is, who Jesus is and who we are as God's children and Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

As we prepare to delve into the mystery of this season, I am sharing with you a letter written by Phil Walker in 1967 on our 100th year anniversary. Phil is the father to Elaine Walker, our current Senior Warden.

His words speak truth to us today, as we are years later led by his faithful daughter Elaine Walker Potter.

Blessed Epiphany. May these words inspire you and may God prepare us in this season to walk the way of love, with great courage and energy...as Christ in the world.

The Future of Grace, by Phil Walker(1967)

"As we look back over the first hundred years of Grace Church we realize through what difficulties and discouragements our parochial ancestors have gone. Now, in the words of the Psalmist, "God has brought us forth into a wealthy place". We have a very fine Church building, beautified by loving thought and work; where we can hear the word of God and offer Eucharist. We have a fully adequate and well-equipped parish house. We have a fine group of intelligent and devoted men and women. We thank God.

Now, as we stand on the threshold of the second century for Grace Church, what of the future? There is always the danger of contentment, contentment with what we are and have, with our personal spiritual life, with our pleasant parish life, with petty activities and money making for our own parish, with unenthusiastic acceptance into our fellowship of those who like our ways well enough to join us: the danger of self-centeredness.

Our world is going through immense and profound changes. Continuation of the past is no longer enough. If Grace Church is to have a vital and worthy future, we must have the courage and faith to face this new world and try to meet its needs. Our parish must become, not just a place for our own religious satisfaction, but a center of training and energizing to send us forth into a needy world.

Our Lord's ministry was, first of all, a proclamation of a message, which we call the Gospel, good news for all humankind. If we believe that Christ revealed to us the living God of his redeeming love for all people; that he opened the way of life more abundant, in this world and the next, then that is the most important fact of life. Therefore we, in faithfulness to Him, must share in that proclamation of the Gospel, not only in church and in our daily life but in the outreach of our corporate parish life. The sanctuary must be for us a center of Spiritual energizing sending us forth; Christ in the world."






From Our (New!) Sr. Warden

Budget Report for November 2021

After eleven months of 2021, we have received Pledged Income of \$305,657, including prepayments for the year. Income from all sources totaled \$368,623, as a result of retained earnings from the prior year, increased payment of pledges and insurance reimbursements. Due to increased expenses, we are still currently in an operating deficit position, although the deficit has been reduced since the prior month to \$4,767.

Mission, Operational, Program, and Personnel expenses at the end of November 2021 totaled \$373,706, \$1370 more than those forecasted in the budget adopted by the Vestry. Expenses have increased as the church continues to reopen and due to the addition of the Bookkeeper. Tech Director and the Associate Priest. These expenses have been countered so far by some projected expenses not materializing

The approved budget included a deficit of \$23,384. The Vestry is hopeful that this will be eliminated by year end with continued payment of pledges. As programs and offerings expand, we have seen greater participation and involvement in both the spiritual and financial life of the Parish. In the event that our optimism isn't rewarded, at present we do have sufficient reserves to adequately cover this possible shortfall.

The 2021 stewardship effort provided \$315,540 of the \$385,000 goal. This amount is more pledged monies than had been received last year; currently, pledged receipts are more than projected. We are prayerfully hopeful that this year will continue to be a bountiful one as Grace grows.
