Greetings Good People of Grace,

As I write you, etched fresh in my mind is last evening's full lunar eclipse. At just near midnight, the earth's shadow finally overtook the moon in its entirety, leaving the sky dark. For this particular lunar eclipse, the moon was to turn a dark, sanguine red. One might think that such a moment would cast a bleak shadow across the broader landscape, but in the absence of the moon's light, the brightness of other objects became more readily apparent. The stars shone brighter, and fireflies that were once obscured from vision under the moon's light now dotted the mountainscape. The landscape before me, though it stood entirely the same as it was before the moon hid behind the earth's shadow, took on entirely new life. What was once hidden was now bright, in the foreground of the Earth's cosmic dance.

On the day of Pentecost, Saint Peter reminded those gathered of Joel's words generations earlier. He speaks, "And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." While this may sound unsettling, I think of these words in the context of the beauty of Pentecost. In the midst of uncertainty and departure, God sent a spirit to unify and reassure people. And in the midst of the spirit's intercession was, and always has been, the movements of the earth. Notice that Pentecost commences with, "... a sound like the rush of a violent wind."

So this month, let us notice the breath of the spirit in the rhythms of the earth around us. In the blooming of the flowers, the harsh summer rains, and the dancing firefly, there is a sign of God.

NAVIGATING THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM can be a nightmare. But you don't have to journey through all the medical-speak by yourself! The new Grace Medical Advocacy Ministry, a team of experienced, committed Grace parishioners (Dodie King, Jeff Russell, Ginny Moser and Jennifer Witt) are available to help you find the resources and advice you need to make informed health care decisions for a loved one, a friend or yourself.

What are your needs? Could you or a loved one benefit from information about:

- Aging in place (how to make a home safe for living in later years)?
- End-of-life issues (death and dying, palliative and hospice care, advanced directives, a healthcare power of attorney)?
- Senior support (home healthcare, caregiver resources including care for the caregiver)?
- Healthcare provider and facility navigation guidance (locating a physician, questions to ask your physician and other providers, insurance questions, tips on using online resources)?



What skills could you bring to this ministry? Are you

- a Medical professional?
- a Social worker?
- an Insurance professional?

A phone survey will be done soon to assess and prioritize interest in the above questions. 

Budget Report for April 2022

- \$47,958.10 of Total Income (Contributions, Building/Admin) and \$34,365.01 of total expenses, resulting in a Net Income of \$13,593.09.
- Contributions were up 30% from last month (\$47,958.10 from \$36,018.91).
- YTD \$167,394.80 of Total Income (Contributions, Building/Admin) and \$140,380.11 of total expenses, resulting in a Net Income of \$27,014.69.
- Endowment valuation is up \$73.9k from last month (\$769,403.69 from \$695,436.79).
- 2021 Audit results are positive.

The recent audit of our financial record-keeping yielded a positive report. The contributions for April increased by 30% relative to March, and the endowment valuation increased by nearly \$74,000.00 from the previous month. We are hopeful that these positive trends will continue. Please keep in mind that if all members increased their contributions by \$1.00 a day, the result would be that contributions would more consistently meet or exceed budget.
