

THE WORD OF GOD

The First Lesson: Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly.

like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing.

The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon.

They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God.



Let's Keep those Food Donations Coming in for ABCCM

Do you know we have "food deserts" in Asheville and 349 total food deserts in North Carolina? Food deserts are areas where there are a large number of low-income residents living in both urban and rural areas. Poverty is usually high and transportation can be limited. Also, food deserts are where many individuals choose to get their meals from convenience stores and mini-markets. And it's where many low-income residents who live far from large grocery stores can get the food to sustain themselves. Crackers, chips and candy bars are prevalent because they're cheap, easy to buy, and usually quicker to satisfy hunger than wholesome food and meals, including fresh fruits and vegetables.

Thankfully, Buncombe County has ABCCM's Crisis Ministry to help those in need. In 2024 alone, ABCCM Crisis Ministry provided assistance to 13,755 households. Food-wise, 31,680 hot meals (120+/day) were served. Also, 124,944 food bags were distributed, and 1,922 individuals and families received emergency assistance.

Now it's our turn to provide the support ABCCM's Crisis Ministry needs. ABCCM really needs your food donations! You can bring them to the lobby at Grace in your Advent Bag, grocery sacks, or other containers.
