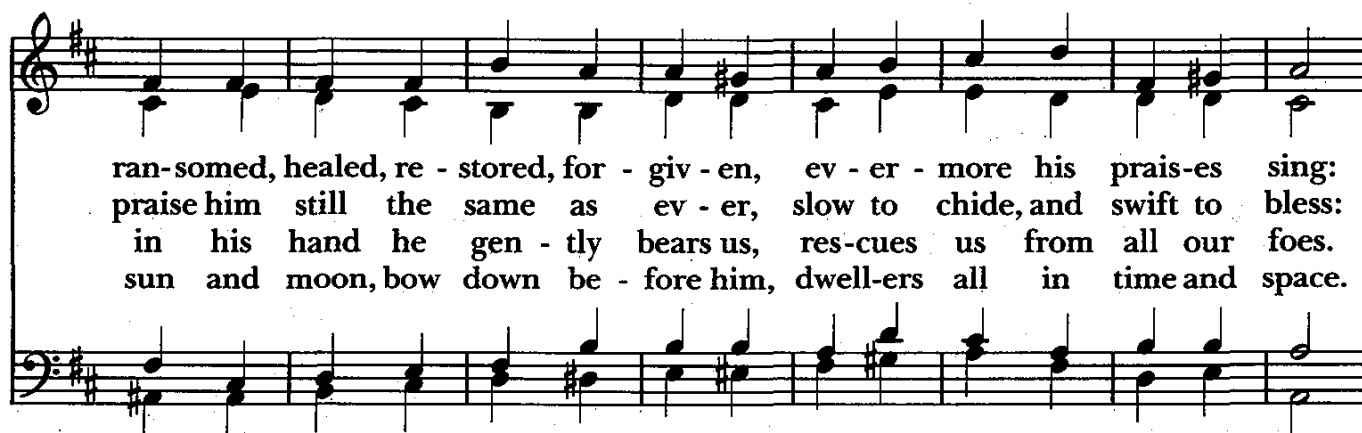
Eternal God, heavenly Father,

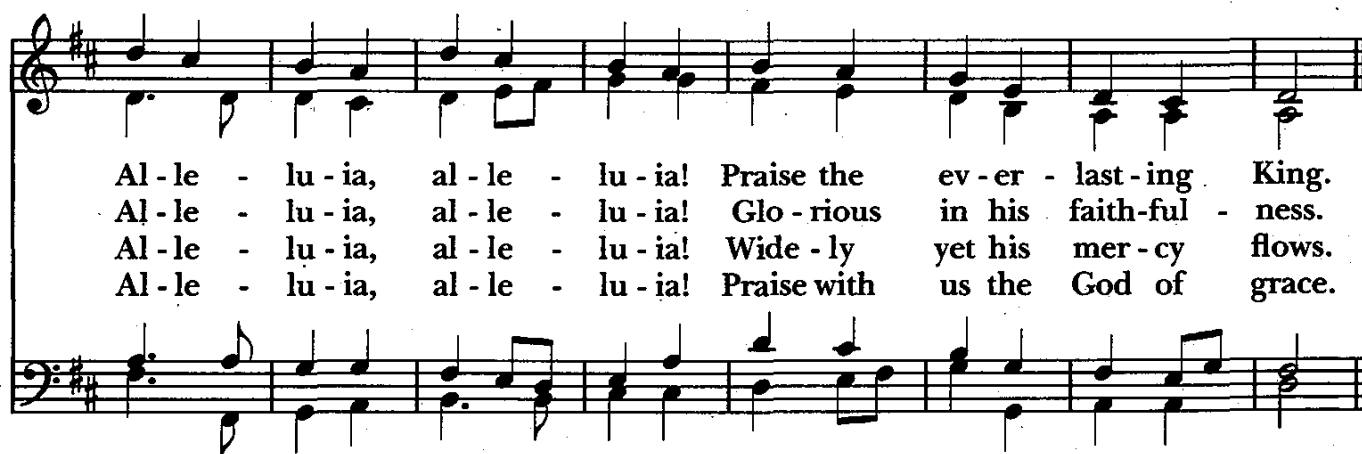
Almighty and everliving God,

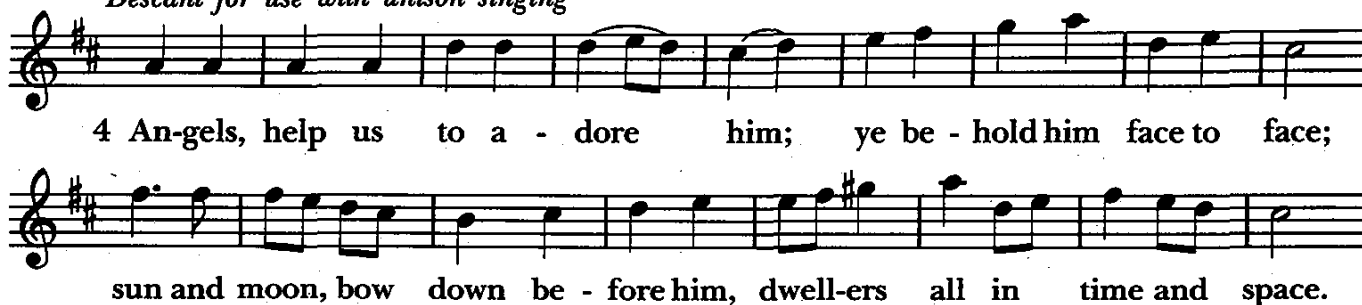
