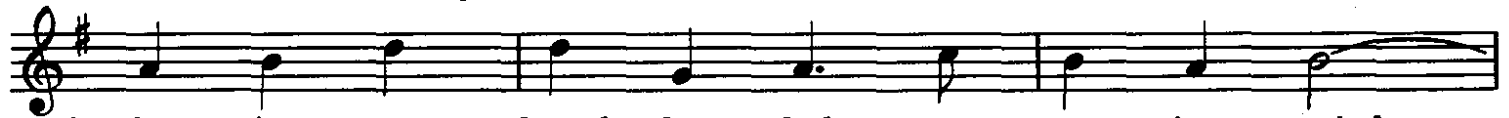

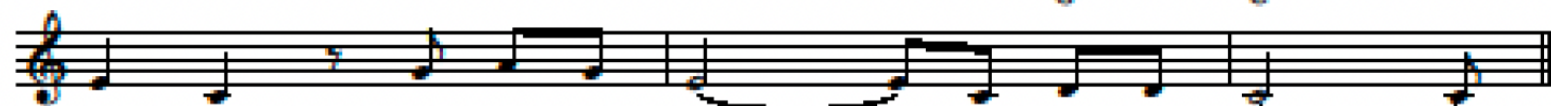

of all that is, seen and unseen.

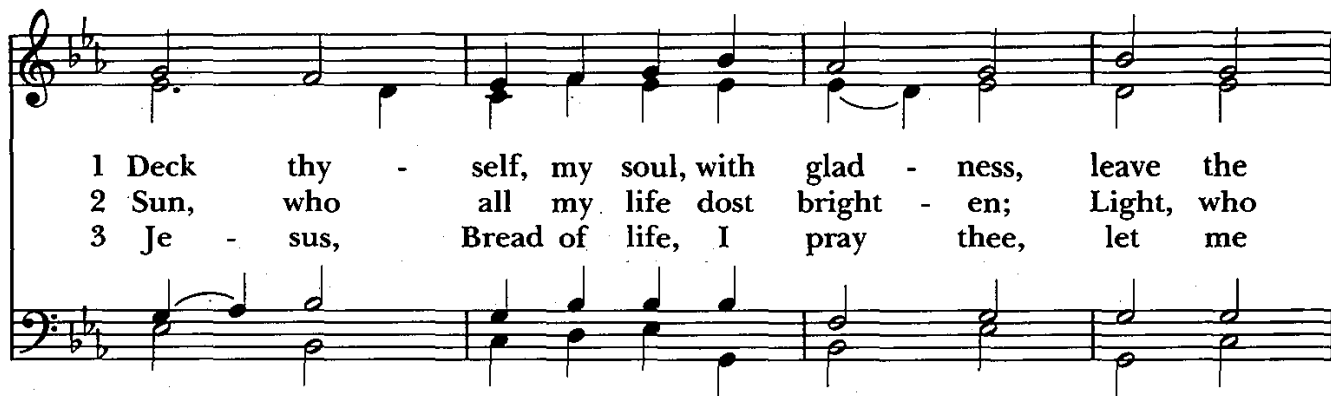
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

and his kingdom will have no end.

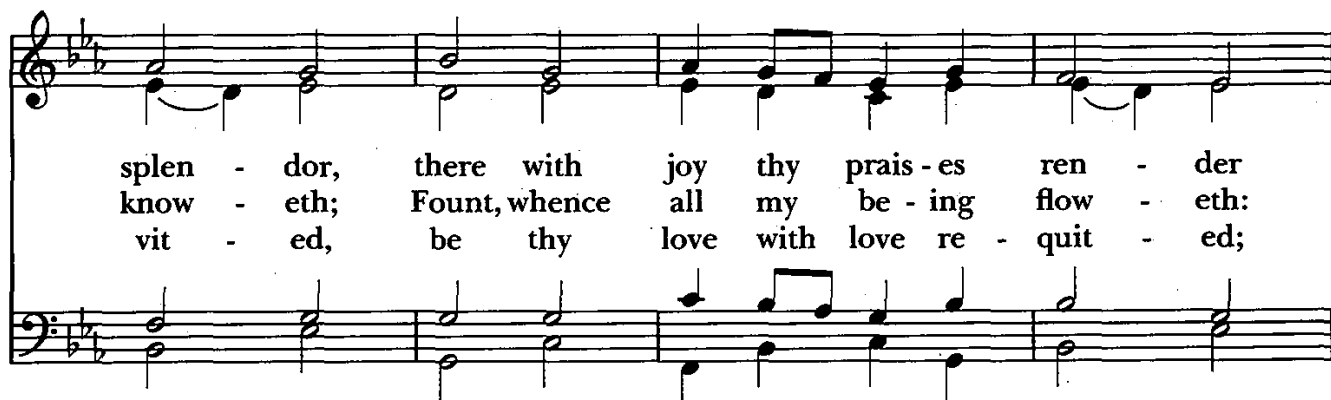
We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

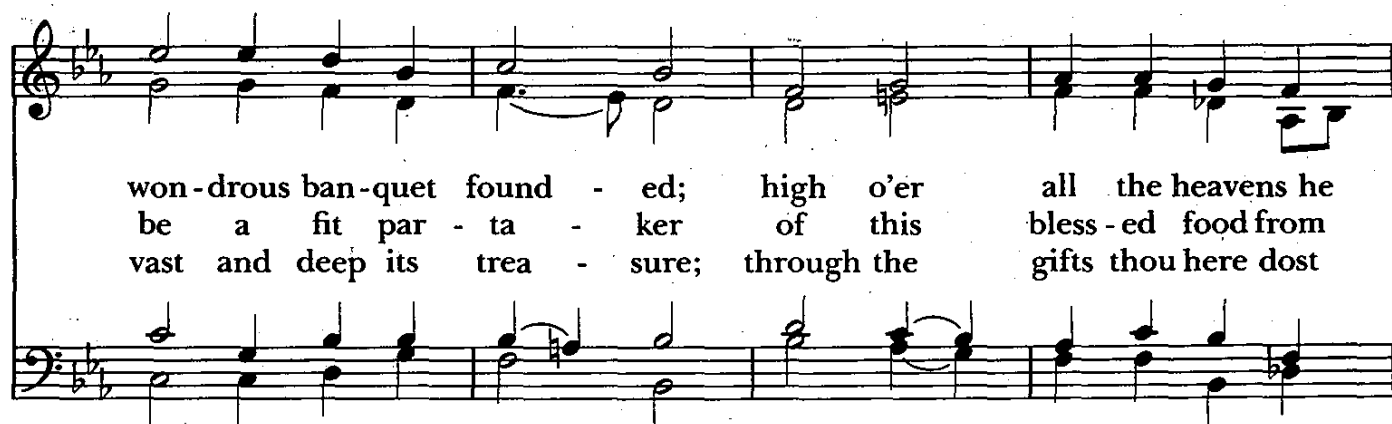

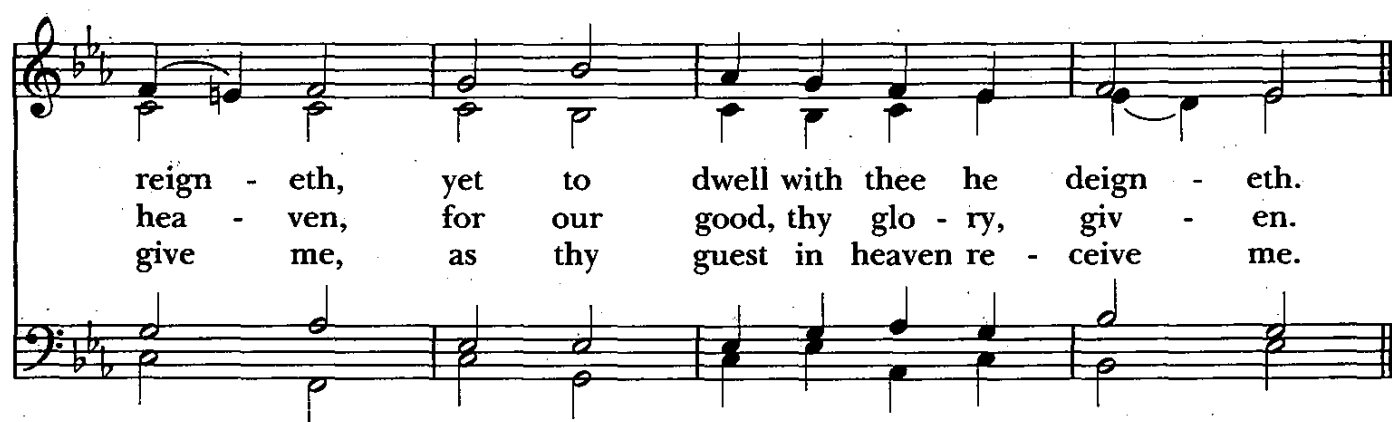

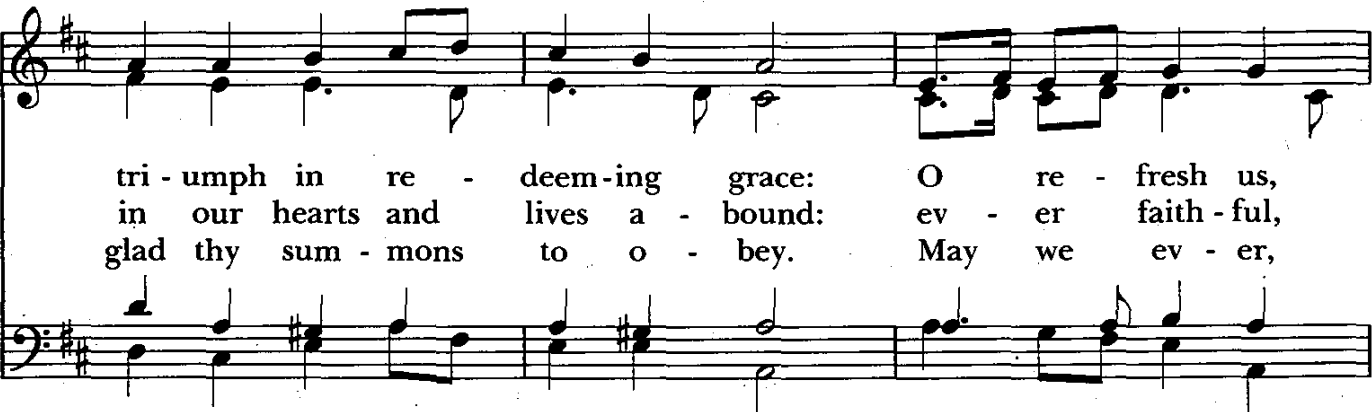
